SWORN STATEMENT

(Q) George A. GARZA

WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH.

(Q) Mr GARZA, do you recall an incident during the My Lai operation concerning the slaying of Vietnamese nationals with an M-79 grenade launcher?

A: Yes, I do. It was on the first day of the operation, in the morning before lunch. We were in a small village about 500 meters north of My Lai (4). I was on the east edge of that village, standing next to a house, either bamboo or mud. Just as I got there I saw ROSCHEVITZ standing about 15-20 yards from a group of 8-10 Vietnamese. The group consisted of various aged women. I remember one child, age and sex unknown. I don't know if there were any men in the group. I was behind ROSCHEVITZ about 3-4 yards and could see him and the group clearly and without obstruction. I do not remember who else was there. At any rate, ROSCHEVITZ fired one M-79 round at the group. That round missed and went over their heads. He immediately reloaded and fired a second round which struck somewhere in the middle of the group. As soon as he fired the second round I turned and walked away because I did not want to watch.

Q: Where did the group come from?

A: All the villagers were being rounded up. I don't know how that particular group was gathered. I guess they lived in the houses in the immediate area.

Q: Upon your arrival at the scene, what was the group doing?

A: They were huddled together, either standing or squatting.

Q: Were they talking or doing anything at all?

A: I don't remember.

Q: Do you recall ROSCHEVITZ speaking?

A: I don't recall.

Q: Were all the people in the group fully clothed?

A: Yes.

Q: Did they do anything to provoke ROSCHEVITZ?

A: Not that I know of. Of course everyone was provoked all ready.

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GAG A: Because they were all VC or VC sympathizers according to what CPT MEDINA had told us.

Q: Why did ROSCHEVITZ shoot the people?

A: I don't know. I don't know if he had an order or did it on his own. No idea.

Q: Do you know if those people were killed?

A: No, I don't.

Q: Do you know what type of round he used in his M-79?

A: No.

Q: Can you further pinpoint the location of this incident?

A: Just near the east edge of the village.

Q: You stated you walked away immediately when he fired the second round. Did you notice the result of that explosion upon the people, wounds, etc, or did you later see their bodies?

A: Later, about 15-30 minutes, I saw their bodies. I don't know if they were dead or alive, and did not look at them close enough to see their wounds.

Q: What were your instructions, as a medic, pertaining to treatment of wounded Vietnamese during the My Lai assault?

A: No instructions. First of all I did not expect to be treating anyone other than our own men. Then as it turned out, I could not see treating persons we had wounded. Plus, I had to preserve my supplies. The operation was to last several more days and the possibility existed that we could have still met opposition.

Q: Were any of the persons in the group wounded prior to being shot by ROSCHEVITZ?

A: They did not appear to be.

Q: How much time elapsed between your arrival at the scene and the firing of the first round by ROSCHEVITZ?

A: I couldn't say. I don't remember.

Q: Can you be more precise as to where the second round landed in relation to the group?

A: No.

Q: Can you describe the dress of the Vietnamese in the group?

A: Black pajamas as best I can remember.

Q: Do you know where the first round went?

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: Over their heads. It went off behind them, 20-30 yards. I don't think anyone was back there.

Q: Did you ever talk to ROSCHEVITZ about this incident?

A: Not that I remember.

Q: Do you think LT BROOKS, your Plt Ldr, knew about this incident?

A: I think he was right there when it happened, but I couldn't swear to that. I'm not certain.
