The above-styled case has been duly referred to trial by General Court-Martial on 17 September 1970, said case to be tried by the court convened by Court-Martial Convening Order Number 37, Headquarters, Third United States Army, Fort McPherson, Georgia, dated 17 September 1970. The court finds that the following orders are necessary and proper in aid of its jurisdiction:

I

Court personnel, all counsel participating in this case and their employees, and all military and civilian personnel who have participated, are participating, or are expected to participate in the processing of this case before, during, or after trial are forbidden from making any public disclosure of any kind, directly or indirectly, except as may be required in the course of judicial proceedings, concerning the evidence in this case from this date forward and until this case is terminated by findings or sentence by the court-martial, should the latter occur, or other legal determination which would finally terminate these proceedings.

II

The official court reporters reporting these proceedings are prohibited from selling, giving, furnishing or disseminating any transcript of these proceedings to any person other than the military judge, counsel for the defense and government, the accused, and those persons hereafter specifically designated by the court.

The Code of Professional Responsibility of the American Bar Association is hereby incorporated in and made a part of this order.

The trial counsel is directed to serve, or caused to be served, a copy of this order on all counsel for the government and the defense, military and civilian court personnel (to include all personnel in the Area Judicial Office, Fort McPherson, Georgia), all military and civilian personnel in the Office of the Staff Judge Advocate, Third United States Army, Fort McPherson, Georgia, the official court reporters, and all other persons who are or are expected to be involved in the processing of this case. A receipt will be obtained from each person upon whom this order is served and returned to this court, indicating the date, time and place said order was received.
