

Charge I : Violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article

Specification: In that Sergeant Charles E. Hutto, US Army, Headquarters Company, US Army Garrison, Fort McPherson, Georgia, then a member of Company C, 1st Battalion, 20th Infantry, 11th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, did, at My Lai (4), Quang Ngai Province, Republic of Vietnam, on or about 16 March 1968, rape a Vietnamese female person, whose name is unknown.

Charge II: Violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 118

Specification: In that Sergeant Charles E. Hutto, US Army, Headquarters Company, US Army Garrison, Fort McPherson, Georgia, then a member of Company C, 1st Battalion, 20th Infantry, 11th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, did, at My Lai (4), Quang Ngai Province, Republic of Vietnam, on or about 16 March 1968, with premeditation, murder a Vietnamese female person, whose name is unknown, by means of shooting her with a rifle.

Charge III: Violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 134

Specification : In that Sergeant Charles E. Hutto, US Army, Headquarters Company, US Army Garrison, Fort McPherson, Georgia, then a member of Company C, 1st Battalion, 20th Infantry, 11th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, did, at My Lai (4), Quang Ngai Province, Republic of Vietnam, on or about 16 March 1968, with intent to commit murder, commit an assault upon an unknown number of unidentified civilian Vietnamese men, women, and children, not less than six, whose names are unknown, by firing his weapon at them.

Additional Charge : Violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 134

Specification: In that Sergeant Charles E. Hutto, US Army, Headquarters Company, US Army Garrison, Fort McPherson, Georgia, then a member of Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 3d Advanced Individual Training Brigade, Fort Lewis, Washington, did, at Fort Lewis, Washington, on or about 17 November 1969, in a statement, wrongfully and unlawfully subscribe under lawful oath, a false statement, in substance as follows: "I was not there. I don't know anything about a girl being raped," which statement he did not then believe to be true.

Charge I : Violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article

Specification: In that Sergeant Charles E. Hutto, US Army, Headquarters Company, US Army Garrison, Fort McPherson, Georgia, then a member of Company C, 1st Battalion, 20th Infantry, 11th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, did, at My Lai (4), Quang Ngai Province, Republic of Vietnam, on or about 16 March 1968, rape a Vietnamese female person, whose name is unknown.

Charge II: Violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 118 *same Person*

Specification: In that Sergeant Charles E. Hutto, US Army, Headquarters Company, US Army Garrison, Fort McPherson, Georgia, then a member of Company C, 1st Battalion, 20th Infantry, 11th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, did, at My Lai (4), Quang Ngai Province, Republic of Vietnam, on or about 16 March 1968, with premeditation, murder a Vietnamese female person, whose name is unknown, by means of shooting her with a rifle.

Charge III: Violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 134

Specification : In that Sergeant Charles E. Hutto, US Army, Headquarters Company, US Army Garrison, Fort McPherson, Georgia, then a member of Company C, 1st Battalion, 20th Infantry, 11th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, did, at My Lai (4), Quang Ngai Province, Republic of Vietnam, on or about 16 March 1968, with intent to commit murder, commit an assault upon an unknown number of unidentified civilian Vietnamese men, women, and children, not less than six, whose names are unknown, by firing his weapon at them.

Additional Charge : Violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 134

Hutto, US Army, Headquarters Company, US Army Garrison, Fort McPherson, Georgia, then a member of Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 3d Advanced Individual Training Brigade, Fort Lewis, Washington, did, at Fort Lewis, Washington, on or about 17 November 1969, in a statement, wrongfully and unlawfully subscribe under lawful oath, a false statement, in substance as follows: "I was not there. I don't know anything about a girl being raped," which statement he did not then believe to be true.
