Dear Captain Maulerson:

This is in reply to your letter of August 24 in which you requested jointly with Captains Cooper, Lantham, Kadish and Lane an opportunity to examine the testimony taken by the My Lai Incident Subcommittee.

I understand your desire to examine that testimony in an effort to avail your clients of every possible defense. I deeply regret, however, that, except for making the testimony of Captain Medina and Captain Kotouc available to their respective counsel for examination at the Subcommittee office, I am unable to comply with your request. The testimony of Captains Medina and Kotouc can only be made available because they appeared as witnesses before the Subcommittee and each witness is entitled to examine his own testimony. He cannot, however, examine the testimony of anyone other than himself.

As you know, the Constitution created the Congress as an independent branch of the Government, separate from and equal to the Executive and the Judicial Branches. Since it is an independent branch, it is our belief that only the Congress can direct disclosure of its legislative records. Consequently, the My Lai Subcommittee has adopted the position that testimony taken during its investigation is not within the purview of the holding in Brady v. Maryland, 373 U.S. 83 (1963), nor is it subject to production under 18 U.S.C. 3500. Accordingly, all requests from both defense and prosecution for an opportunity to examine the testimony have been, and will continue to be, denied.

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
