COLONEL KENNETH A. HOWARD

Colonel Kenneth A. Howard, a native of Atlanta, Georgia, was graduated from Boys High School in 1942. In 1950 he received an L.L.B. degree from Emory University.

During World War II, Colonel Howard served in the United States Navy as a Signalman First Class on a destroyer in the southwest Pacific.

He returned to active duty in May 1951. His first Army assignment was appellate government attorney in the Pentagon. He went to Greenland and Labrador in 1954 where he served as Deputy Staff Judge Advocate in the Northeast Air Command. His next assignments were as Chief, Military Justice at Fort Benning, Georgia and the 3d Armored Division in Frankfurt, Germany. He returned to the United States in 1962 and served as Chief, Military Justice and Deputy Staff Judge Advocate at the Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas until 1965. From 1965 to 1967, Colonel Howard was Chief, Military Justice Division at the Judge Advocate General's School. Since that time, he has served as Circuit Judge with the U. S. Army Judiciary with duty stations at Fort McPherson, Georgia and Saigon, Republic of Vietnam. In July 1970, he returned to Fort McPherson and became the Area Military Judge of Judicial Area III, U. S. Army Judiciary.

Colonel Howard's decorations and awards include the Legion of Merit; Bronze Star; Army Commendation Medal with First and Second Oak Leaf Clusters; Asia-Pacific Ribbon with eight battle stars; World War II Victory and Far East Occupation Ribbons; Philippine Liberation Ribbon with one star; Vietnam Service Medal with two stars; and the Vietnam Campaign Medal with attached device, 1960.

He completed the Judge Advocate General Basic Course at Fort Myer, Virginia in 1961; the Judge Advocate General Advanced Course at the University of Virginia in 1967; the National Defenders Course at Northwestern University in 1965; and a course at the National College of State Trial Judges, University of North Carolina in 1968.

Colonel and Mrs. Howard, the former Sarah M. Moeller, reside in southwest Atlanta. They have two sons, Sterling W. Howard and Kenneth A. Howard, II; and a daughter, Constance E. Prince.

His parents, Colonel (retired) and Mrs. Sterling B. Howard, live in Largo, Florida.
