

LIEUTENANT COLONEL BOBBY G. BERRYHILL

Lieutenant Colonel Bobby G. Berryhill was born on October 3, 1931 in Cochran, Georgia. He was graduated from Lanier High School in Macon, Georgia in 1950. He attended Mercer University from 1950 to 1952 and received a B.B.A. Degree from the University of Georgia in 1954.

Lieutenant Colonel Berryhill received his commission through the Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC) and entered military service at Fort Knox, Kentucky in September 1954. Following completion of the Officers Basic Course at Fort Knox, he was assigned to Fort Campbell, Kentucky as a platoon leader. He attended the Flight Training School at Fort Rucker, Alabama in 1955-56 and was later assigned to Fort Sill, Oklahoma. He was an aviator in Korea in 1957-58 and a company commander and combat support flight leader at Fort Devens, Massachusetts from 1958 to 1962. His next assignment was in Germany as an aviator in target acquisition and aerial surveillance and as a maintenance officer. He was a battalion S-3 (training) at Fort Hood, Texas in 1965. His next assignment was in Vietnam (1965-66) as battalion S-4 (logistics) with the 14th Combat Aviation Battalion. In 1966-69 he was an instructor at Fort Rucker. He attended the Officers Advance Course at Fort Knox in 1960. His present assignment is Chief, Readiness Branch, Training Division, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Operations and Training, Third U. S. Army Headquarters.

His awards and decorations include the Air Medal with two clusters, the Army Commendation Medal with one Oak Leaf Cluster, the Flight Badge, and the Parachutist Badge.
