

MAJOR DUDLEY J. BUDRICH

Major Dudley J. Budrich was born on March 17, 1934 in Chicago, Illinois. He received his B. S. Degree from Kansas University, Lawrence, Kansas in 1957.

Major Budrich, a distinguished military graduate, received his commission through the Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC). He entered military service on July 8, 1957 at Lawrence, Kansas. He has been stationed at Fort Ord, California; Schofield Barracks, Hawaii; Fort Benning, Georgia; Fort McClellan, Alabama; and in Vietnam. His duty assignments have been platoon leader, executive officer, company commander, brigade S-3 (training), and plans and training officer. During his first assignment in Vietnam (1966-67), he was Staff Advisor and Regimental Senior Advisor, 25th Vietnamese Division, 49th Regiment. He returned to Vietnam in 1969 and was a plans officer on the staff of Amphibious Group Three, U. S. Navy. His present assignment is Training Officer in the Training Division of the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Operations and Training, Third U. S. Army Headquarters.

His decorations and awards include the Bronze Star Medal for meritorious service, the Air Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, and the Vietnamese Gallantry Cross with Silver Star.

Major Budrich's military education includes the Basic Infantry Officers Course (1957) and the Infantry Officers Career Course (1963) at Fort Benning; and the Military Assistance Training Advisor Course at Fort Bragg, North Carolina in 1966.

His hobbies are golf and tennis. He is an airborne ranger.
