THIS IS TO CERTIFY that the undersigned Surveyor to this Bureau, did, at the request of the Owners Representative, United States of America, Department of Navy, Military Sea Transportation Service, Maintenance and Repair Division, Western Pacific Area, Yokosuka, Japan attend the twin screw steamer "General John Pope" of 17927 gross tons as she lay afloat at Center Pier No. 2, Yokohama, Japan on the 23rd day of June 1954, in order to examine and report upon repairs to after port boiler economizer. For further particulars see vessel's log book and report as follows.


Upon examination after port boiler economizer opened out for examination, and the number's E9 and F-9 economizer tube elements had been seal welded to the headers and tubes rerolled economizer found clean and in a satisfactory condition.

It was recommended economizer be closed up hydrostatically tested 450 PSI and proven tight and casing doors replaced.

Survey complete.

The foregoing examination and test having been satisfactorily completed the vessel is considered eligible to retain her present Class with this Bureau.
