MEDICAL DEPARTMENT INSTRUCTION 6010.1

To: Medical Department Personnel

Subj: Medical Department Duties; establishment of

1. Purpose. The purpose of this instruction is to provide policy for departmental duties in port and at sea.

2. General. The following policy regarding Medical Department duties is hereby established and will be adhered to by all Medical Department personnel attached to this vessel for duty.

3. At Sea.

a. Medical Officer. At sea the Medical Officer will be available for Sick Call at the designated time, and will be available at any time for emergencies. The duty corpsman will keep himself informed of the whereabouts of the Medical Officer at all times.

b. Enlisted Personnel. At sea the Hospital Corpsmen will rotate on a sectional watch. Duties will be stood from 0800 to 0800 the following day. The duty corpsman will not leave the Sick Bay without being properly relieved. The corpsman having the duty the following day will provide relief for meals.

4. Foreign Ports.


a. The Medical Officer will inform the duty corpsman when he departs from the ship.

b. Enlisted Personnel. In foreign ports the Hospital Corpsmen will stand duties in accordance with the Military Departments policies.

5. San Francisco.

A. In San Francisco, the Medical Officer and the Medical Administrative Assistant will keep informed of the ship's plans and be sure that the Duty Corpsman has their current telephone numbers.

b. Enlisted Personnel. In San Francisco the Hospital Corpsmen will stand their duties in accordance with the Military Departments policies.
