Chairman pro tem, John J. Meehan convened the meeting and officially introduced the following: Captain H. L. Heinz, our luncheon host and ship's Master; Captain T. F. Saunders, MSTS Chief of Staff; Mr. Charles W. Mickel, Safety Director, Soule' Steel and Guest Speaker; Mr. T. E. Hannon, Regional Director, G.S.A. and Chairman of the Federal Executive Board; Mr. David R. Pollock, Incoming Chairman, I.R.S.; Harold W. Webber, Incoming Vice Chairman, Dept. of Transportation; R. C. Easterbrook, Incoming Secretary, Dept. of Interior; and other members of the Council's Executive Committee.

Captain Heinz officially "Welcomed Aboard" Council members and guests, expressing his pleasure to behold such enthusiasm and interest in the Federal Safety Council's activities, as shown by the large attendance.

Captain Saunders discussed the progress MSTS has made in cooperation with the President's Mission Safety 70 Program and noted that although MSTS was somewhat handicapped by an approximate 25 percent increase in new employees, the accident frequency rate was reduced to 2.86 last year.

Mr. T. E. Hannon expressed his gratitude for the invitation to attend the luncheon and stated that he was pleased to see union representation at the Federal Safety Council's functions. He also stressed his desire to achieve closer ties with labor in the safety effort. As in the past, Mr. Hannon offered the full support of the Federal Executive Board to the Council in their effort to further the goal of Mission Safety 70.

Mr. Meehan expressed his appreciation for the opportunity to serve as chairman of the Federal Safety Council, if only for the short period of six months, since the Council has had a turnover of three Chairmen during 1967. He complimented his predecessors, Walter Sorensen, Donald Fischer and members of the Executive Committee for having performed an excellent job, and especially acknowledged the fine support of Secretary Harold Webber during his term in office. In closing, Mr. Meehan said that he will remain within the folds of the Council, by serving on the

Executive Committee. The speaker's gavel and the Council's 1966 Safety Award of Merit were then officially transferred to the new Chairman for 1968, David R. Pollock.

Mr. Pollock spoke of the aims and goals of the Council for the coming year, emphasizing the need for more active participation by its members. He discussed the subject of future programs, mainly the February 9th meeting, which will feature Mr. Paul O'Rourke, Regional Training Officer, I.R.S. as program speaker. Mr. O'Rourke's text will focus on management's role in safety.

Mr. Pollock urged the membership to encourage personnel in management positions to attend this worthwhile program.

Our program speaker, Mr. Charles W. Mickel, presented an excellent talk, which centered on the philosophical aspects of safety motivation and safety practices in private industry and placed emphasis on the "dollar" meaning of accidents, by way of influencing the support of management. How accident costs and responsibilities should affect the performance records of the first-line supervisors since accidents are a reflection on their work performance.

Chairman Pollock then expressed his appreciation and thanks to Captain Heinz and his crew for the excellent luncheon and extended his congratulations to the Luncheon Chairman, Charles W. Lockard, for his fine job of organization.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:05 p.m. At the invitation of Captain Heinz, the members toured the ship before departing.
