INSTRUCTIONS

Entries in Section II should not be repeated in Section I.
4. If any required drill was not conducted during the month, note reason in date space for the drill.
5. Attach a brief summary of any rescues or casualties, with evaluation of crew performance and damage control equipment.
6. This form should be ordered from home port commander. Area and subarea commanders requisition from Navy Supply System as cognizance "[" material].
