**INSTRUCTIONS**

3. All training conducted during the month except emergency drills should be recorded in Section I. Section II is for emergency drills only, as required by effective edition of COMSTS INSTRUCTION P3120.2 (*Administrative and Operating Procedures for MSTs Ships*). Entries in Section II should not be repeated in Section I.
4. If any required drill was not conducted during the month, note reason in date space for the drill.
5. Attach a brief summary of any rescues or casualties, with evaluation of crew performance and damage control equipment.
6. This form should be ordered from home port commander. Area and subarea commanders requisition from Navy Supply System as cognizance "I" material.


**REMARKS**
