

QUESTION & ANSWER BOX (cont.)

Q. WHAT IS THE MISSION OF THE TRAINING AIDS SUPPORT ACTIVITIES?

A. The mission of the Training Aids Support Activities is to provide training aids services to Regular Navy (including Forces Afloat), and Naval Reserve Commands, including development, production, procurement, distribution, repair and disposal of training aids to support training programs for which the Chief of Naval Personnel is responsible. Not included is support of professional medical and technical aviation training.

Q. WHAT GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS ARE ASSIGNED TO THE NAVAL TRAINING AIDS CENTERS FOR TECHNICAL DIRECTION OF THE TRAINING AIDS PROGRAMS?

Q. WHAT ARE TRAINING AIDS?

A. Training aids are materials such as films, transparencies, models, charts, mock-ups, tape recordings, and other such audio-visual materials.

Q. WHAT ARE TRAINING AID EQUIPMENTS?

A. Training aid equipments are equipments which are used to display training aids. Includes items such as motion picture projectors, overhead projectors, slide projectors, tape recorders/playback units, record players, opaque projectors and so forth.

Q. WHAT ARE TRAINING DEVICES?

A. Training devices are items designed for training purposes to simulate equipment or portions thereof, or to create or duplicate the operational environment in the training situation. Usually, although not in every case, the device has been developed by Naval Training Device Center, Orlando, Florida.

"SIDELIGHTS", published periodically by the Naval Training Aids Center, San Francisco, provides information concerning training aids which are available from the Naval Training Aids Center, together with pertinent suggestions and helpful hints on their procurement and utilization.

"SIDELIGHTS" may be used to supplement NAVWEPS 10-1-777, U.S. Navy Film Catalog of 1 May 1966. The format is such that each page on which films are listed may be cut up into 3"x5" cards and filed for reference.

Training aids include such demonstrative and manipulative items as training films, charts, transparencies, slides, models, mock-ups, flannel graphics, cutaways, disc and tape recordings, demonstrators, training devices and other trainers.

Training aids may be procured by Regular Navy and Naval Reserve commands on a temporary loan or permanent custody basis. Requests for loans may be made by letter, but use of form 12ND GBN 337 (Rev. 1-66), Training Aids Temporary Loan Request/Invoice, is preferred. Forms are available from the Naval Training Aids Center, San Francisco.

Requests for training aids to be retained on a permanent custody basis should be submitted by letter with the following information:

1. Identification number and title of aid
2. Quantity of aid
3. Frequency of use (number of days per year aid will be used)
4. Curriculum number, title and topic with which aid will be used
5. If aid is not for curriculum support, include:
 - a. Type of training program
 - b. Learning objective for which aid is intended
 - c. Ranks/rates of trainees



Q. WHO DIRECTS THE BUPERS TRAINING AIDS PROGRAM?

A. The General Military Training and Support Division (Pers-C4) of the Bureau of Naval Personnel directs the training aids program.

Q. HOW MANY TRAINING AIDS CENTERS ARE THERE IN THE UNITED STATES?

A. There are two Naval Training Aids Centers; one is located in Brooklyn, New York, the other is located on Treasure Island, San Francisco, California.



Q. ARE THERE ANY OTHER TRAINING AIDS ACTIVITIES WHICH SERVICE INDIVIDUAL COMMANDS?

A. Yes, the Bureau of Naval Personnel has established TRAINING AIDS SECTIONS in most Naval Districts, a TRAINING AIDS FACILITY in San Diego and TRAINING AIDS LIBRARIES in WESTPAC.
