Subject: GENERAL EDWIN D. PATRICK, Undocumented; deficiencies

Gentlemen:

The following outstanding requirements were noted on CG 835 issued to the Master on 15 August 1967:

1. Prior to departure this port but not later than 30 September 1967, repair and prove operational water-tight door 6-158-0 as designated on ship's damage control plans.
2. Prior to 30 January 1968, remove semi-permanent dunnage or parts thereof in lower holds in order to make inspection of internal structural members possible.
3. Prior to 30 January 1968, scale and clean tank top in way of #4 double bottom between frames 78 and 93 to facilitate further inspection.
4. Prior to 30 January 1968, scale and clean pipe tunnel (designated 6-142-2-Q on D.C. plans) and associated drain well (designated 7-172-2-W on D.C. plans) to facilitate further inspection.

Please advise this office, in writing, when the above requirements have been completed and examined by a Coast Guard Inspector.
