

Unit History

FOR OVER SIXTY YEARS THE 23RD MILITARY POLICE COMPANY HAS FAITHFULLY FULFILLED ITS DUTIES IN WAR AND PEACE. THE 23RD WAS ORIGINALLY ACTIVATED ON 1 MAY 1943 ON NEW CALEDONIA. THE UNIT SAW ACTION DURING WORLD WAR II ON THE NORTHERN SOLOMONS, LEYTE AND THE SOUTHERN PHILIPPINES.

DURING THE VIETNAM CONFLICT THE 23RD MILITARY POLICE COMPANY WAS ASSIGNED TO THE AMERICAL DIVISON AND TOOK PART IN EVERY OPERATION THAT PROUD DIVISION CONDUCTED TO INCLUDE THE 1969 TET COUNTER OFFENSIVE.

UPON COMPLETION OF THE UNIT'S MISSION IN VIETNAM THE UNIT WAS INACTIVATED ON 28 JUNE 1972.
