The customer requires that the aircraft Log Sheet be coded according to his letters which represent the type of load and the using customer.

These code letters are to be entered in the customer use column on the right side of the AFL.

Air-craft working shuttles from Vientiane or Udorn do not need to code the AFL as long as they are doing the assigned work according to the flight service order part of the AFL.

Aircraft shuttling between sites or to DZ's must get the code letters for each leg from the dispatching customer.


The customer at L-16 is putting the code letters on the load manifest for most loads at the rigging shed. Place these letters in the customer use column.

When these code letters are not available either on the manifest or thru the dispatcher verbally then enter in the "remarks column". The nature of the load you are carrying, ie- Troops, Refugees, Rice, etc

Make an effort to assist the customer with his aircraft use expense

Remember it is easier to do this at the time of your loading rather than 3 days later.
