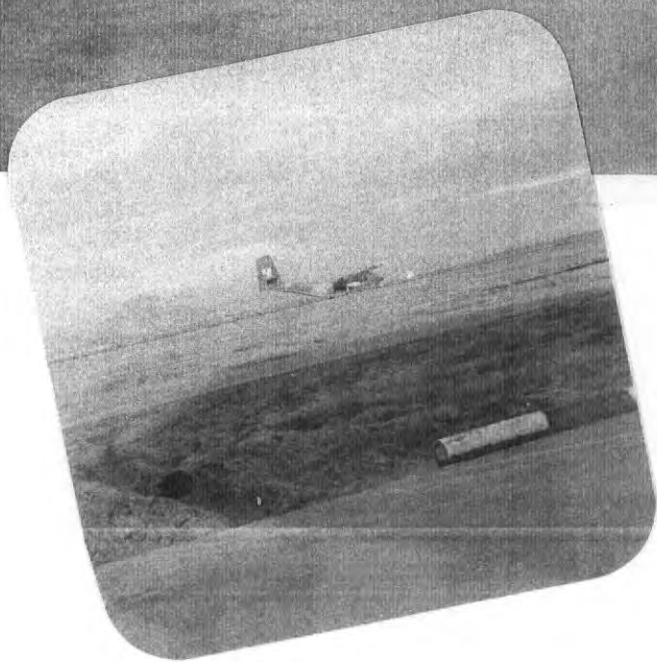




Christmas 1971,
