University of Colorado Summer Session Boulder, Colorado

An integrated program of graduate and undergraduate courses on various phases of Asian history, civilization, philosophy, political science, and geography will be offered during both terms of the 1960 Summer Session at the University of Colorado in Boulder. Scholarships are available as noted below.

The institute program courses are open to all regularly qualified Summer Session students, and may be counted toward undergraduate or graduate degree requirements (students from other institutions should consult with their own advisers about the transferability of credits from the University of Colorado Summer Session to their own institutions). The courses listed also count toward those for the B.A. degree with a major in Asian studies, as established in the University of Colorado College of Arts and Sciences.

In the above listings, L. refers to Lower Division courses, open to freshmen and sophomores, but also to more advanced students. U. refers to Upper Division courses, open to juniors, seniors, and graduate students. Courses numbered 500 are primarily for graduate students, but may be taken by qualified seniors, with special permission of the instructor. Courses numbered 600 are for graduate students only. The number following the course number, e.g., 474-2, refers to the number of semester credit hours provided by the course.

In addition to classroom work, there will be special lectures, discussions, films, exhibits, and other events dealing with Asian cultures and problems.

The University Library has basic reference and research materials on Asian civilization and current affairs, including a large number of periodicals, and a basic collection in the Chinese language. The University Library is one of the 16 depository members of the Human Relations Area Files, a research organization engaged in the collection, organization, and distribution of information concerning mankind.

ADMISSION

SCHOLARSHIPS

Secondary school teachers are eligible to apply for one of the 10 to 20 scholarships of \$200 or \$100 each offered through the Asia Society, Japan Society, and Asia Foundation, for the 5- or 10-week Asian Studies Program. These are intended for teachers who may be able to utilize Asian subject matter in the teaching of secondary level subjects. LIVING ACCOMMODATIONS

Living accommodations are available in excellent modern residence halls. About \$40 weekly covers typical tuition and fees and board and room charges for nonresidents of Colorado; less for Colorado residents.
