## LIBRARY - WRITE-UP

LIGHT-HORSE HARRY by Noel B. Gerson. This is a biography of Washington's great cavalryman, General Henry Lee. Mr. Gerson's previous experience in writing fictional biography has been put to good use now in writing a very readable yet authentic story of one of the real heroes of the American revolution. Young Lee's skill as a horseman and as a commander who earned the devotion of his troops was put to good use on many occasions by Generals Washington and Greene. Military tactics are explained in a very understandable style.

SEA OF TREASURE by Harry E. Rieseberg. Whatever leads a man to follow a dream led the author to leave a secure job with the Government, and embark on a new career of underwater treasure salvage. He began this adventurous life years ago when divers used hard hat diving suits connected to a ship-board air compressor. The comparative lack of mobility this equipment offered made every dive a dangerous experience. This book relates in part, some of his underwater encounters with hazards such as giant squid, loss of air and ancient superstitions. There are compensations, however; like bars of gold or solid silver found during a routine search of a sunken wreck.

DANDY IN MOSCOW by Derek Marlowe. As Alexander Ebrlin, he was only a collector and evaluator of information for a British secret agency, but when the Russian orders came through he would revert to his original role of Krasnevin, assassin for the K.G.B. In spite of his homesickness for Russia, he enjoyed his quiet London life. Then everything went wrong, he was ordered to get Krasnevin. His Russian contact vanished, and he goes on a wild chase through Berlin in the company of his British colleague Gatiss. This is a concoction of the double deal as well as the double agent and the double meaning that will find a place in large mystery collections. This is one of the best sellers on the list.
