

This is to acknowledge receipt of the documents/letter for IV(*) 44303, which the ODP received on 19 Aug. 88. We regret that the high volume of ODP cases and inquiries prevents our giving you a more formal response than this letter.

Please note that this is only to advise you that we have received your correspondence. It does not indicate that the file was reviewed. File review for LOI issuance is done in accordance with an established schedule of priorities. Once the review is completed, the relative or friend in the U.S. is contacted should further documents or information be needed.

If a case already has an LOI, the next steps in the processing will normally be issuance of an exit permit and an interview with representatives of the ODP in Vietnam. This part of the processing is controlled by the Vietnamese authorities. If your friends or relatives in Vietnam are made available to the ODP for interview, the sponsor in the U.S. will be informed of any actions necessary.

Please notify the ODP immediately if the Principal Applicant in Vietnam or the sponsor in the U.S. has a change of address.

U.S. ORDERLY DEPARTURE PROGRAM (ODP) PROCESSING

The U.S. Orderly Departure Program (ODP) has brought over 60,000 people to the U.S. from Vietnam since the program began in 1979. In general, eligibility for the U.S. ODP is based on having sponsoring relatives in the U.S. or proven close association with U.S. policies and programs in Vietnam prior to 1975.

ODP files can be opened on the basis of Affidavits of Relationship (AOR), Immigrant Visa Petitions (Form I-130), Visas 93 cables or ODP Questionnaires indicating close association. Spouses, children, parents and siblings of people residing in the U.S. are eligible for the family reunification aspect of the ODP. Grandparents, grandchildren or other relations may be included in the files, but their eligibility for the ODP will be determined at the time of their interview when a decision will be made as to their dependency on the family unit.

In most cases, once a file is opened the next step in the U.S. processing is review for issuance of a Letter of Introduction (LOI). The LOI is a document which states that the U.S. is willing to interview the person or persons named on the LOI for possible acceptance for movement through the U.S. ODP. It is not a guarantee of approval. The LOI is normally presented to the Vietnamese authorities by the applicants as a preliminary step in obtaining exit permits and pre-departure interviews. Please note that it is the Vietnamese authorities who control the issuance of exit permits.

The success of the ODP has attracted a large number of applicants. Because of this, priorities have been established for LOI review and issuance. Family reunification cases will be reviewed for LOI issuance only when the applicants are the beneficiaries of current or near-current Immigrant Visa Petitions and would therefore be able to travel to the U.S. as immigrants. This priority system allows the ODP to reserve limited refugee numbers for those who are not eligible for immigrant status. The number of immigrants who can be accepted into the U.S. each year is far greater than the number of refugees allowed.

Visas 93 beneficiaries are also eligible for LOI review. However, as they would enter the U.S. as refugees, review of cases of Immigrant Visa Petition beneficiaries has priority over review of cases based solely on Visas 93. It is strongly recommended that second preference petitions be filed as soon as the U.S. relative is eligible to do so.

The immigration channel will continue to be emphasized in the foreseeable future. If sponsors are eligible to file Immigrant Visa Petitions for their relatives the ODP urges them to do so. Relatives in the U.S. may continue to send AOR's and other documents to the ODP office in Bangkok to serve as the foundation for a future Immigrant Visa file. The file will not be reviewed for an LOI, however, until the petition has been received and is close to being current.

LOI's will continue to be issued to applicants for refugee status who are of special humanitarian concern. These will primarily be Amerasians and their accompanying family members, long term reeducation camp inmates, or people with previous close association with U.S. policies and programs.

After the applicants have received exit permits, their names will be placed on a list which is given to the ODP by the Vietnamese authorities. The people on the list are subsequently interviewed in Ho Chi Minh City by representatives of the U.S. ODP. Once the people on the case are approved documentarily they must undergo a medical examination. If there are no medical ineligibilities the ODP office in Bangkok transmits final approval to the Vietnamese authorities, through the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) Working Group. The case is then manifested by the Vietnamese for a flight to Bangkok.

In Bangkok, approved ODP applicants are housed in a transit center where final paperwork and medical checks are completed. They generally stay in Bangkok for about one week. All immigrants then travel directly to the U.S. The majority of refugees are sent for six months of language training and cultural orientation in the Philippines before travelling to the U.S.

All travel arrangements are made and paid for by the International Organization for Migration (IOM, formerly ICM), to be reimbursed later. The U.S. sponsor will be notified of the exact itinerary by a local voluntary agency.

The entire process depends on many variables so it is impossible to predict how long any segment of the procedures will take.

It is very important that ODP be notified immediately of any address changes either in Vietnam or the U.S. Delays in processing have occurred due to ODP having outdated addresses on file.




