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My name is TUAN HOANG KHAC
a former political prisoner of the Vietnamese communist regime.
I am currently residing at

TACOMA WA 98405 of Tuyen Duc Province VN
Before April 1975, I was a Director of Physical Training Education for youth
in the armed forces of the Republic of Vietnam (in the government of the Republic of
Vietnam). After the communists came to power, I was imprisoned in a re-education camp
from (Feb/05/77 to Feb/01/81) Camp Dai Binh Bao Loc City Lam Dong
Viet Nam

Because of that experience I have been admitted to the United States on April/19/1996
H.O. 44.592 in accordance with a subprogram of the Oderly Departure Program for
former political
prisoners under a bilateral agreement between Vietnam and the United States. While I
am grateful for the chance to resettle in the United States, my resettlement has been
made extremely difficult because the following unmarried children of mine have been
rejected for resettlement despite the fact that for many years unmarried children were
permitted to
accompany their parents who were former political prisoners.

Because of the change in policy my wife has had to stay back in Vietnam caus-
ing untold suffering to our family. After long separation due to my imprisonment, our
family now continues to be split at a time when we thought that we could be reunited.
