Thưa quý vị:

Tôi tên Huỳnh Long Hối, ngụ tại MPLS/MN, sau khi
đọc bản tin của quý vị trên báo Ngày Nay (31/3/99) chợt nhớ lại
hồi còn ở VN. Tôi có 2 lần biên thư nhờ con thiệp. Khi qua đây, lúc
luật MAC CAIN-MOI RA ĐỔI (1 lần). Nay luật ấy lại được MỞ RỘNG. Vì chưa lần
nào gửi hồ sơ nên tôi quyết định (lập một chi tiết gửi đến quý vị), trong
khi chờ VBCNVB hồi âm và lương dân, vì đây là một trong những cơ
định là nạn nhân của cái quái thai HỔ KHẨU KHÔNG LIÊN TỤC nó hãm
hại tử bất lâu nay, tất nhiên cũng phải thừa nhận câu: "Lơ sâu làm
râu nổi cơn", một người làm xấu cái bầu mang nhớ "là ở chỗ này".
Nhưng với thời gian như vậy đã quá đủ để người ta điều chỉnh tình
trạng, giải quyết những khó khăn, phức tạp cũng như dọn dẹp
những gì cần thiết... rồi. Và đây là lúc phải phục hồi danh dự và quyền
lợi cho những nạn nhân của nó để có sự công minh tạm chấp nhận!

Ngày xưa tôi nhận thư hồi âm của VBCNVB, làm theo hướng
dẫn và gửi đi ngay hôm qua (từ 13/99-15/4/99), thời gian lâu như vậy
mà hồ sơ này chưa xong! Có như thế lý do khiến tôi vô cùng bối rối,
cái con thỏ nó vừa thúi bạch... vừa nghe người thân nó báo tôi phải
làm như vậy như kia bởi lẽ nó nghe như câu nguồn tin về ODP & Ty nạn
rồi hoang mang không xác định được điểm đúng vào lúc này, khiến cho
tôi phải khó khăn giải thích, đôi khi không dẫn được những cơ sở phân
nó thì làm sao trình bày trở lại sự việc đây từ... trung thực có thể
tự theo thời gian mà thành được những từ ngữ sặc mùi... thêm
vào đây là những yêu tố về việc không cho phép tôi nghỉ lâu, đau
lưng nhức đầu chóng mặt... qua đây hơn 3 năm mà giải phẫu 3 lần vào
mùa hè để lấy cái hạch dưới xương quay hàm. Cứ mỗi xong là
hơn 1 tháng sau là nó mọc lại (2 lần bên phải thì nó đổi tra đến 3 lần
qua bên trái) rồi bên trái 1 lần thì nay nó đã mọc lại và cũng từ

Dear Congressman Sabo:

I am writing to seek your assistance in my effort to obtain a reunion with my children left behind in Vietnam and to re-establish my family. I was admitted to the U.S. as a refugee but had to leave my children behind. There are many families in your district facing the same problem. Section 274 of H.R. 1211 seeks to remedy this problem. I ask you to write to Chairman Benjamin Gilman in support of this Section.


I have written to your office in the past to explain about my situation and to seek help. My children were left behind because in early 1994, The Orderly Departure Program (ODP) in Bangkok came up with the "continuous co-residency" requirement. Children without their names listed continuously in their parents' family register would be automatically excluded from refugee interviews.

In reality, family registration is not an indicator of co-residency. In fact, the Procedural Guidance issued by the Immigration and Naturalization Service (NS) lists denial of family registration as a form of mistreatment against blacklisted families. A few months after our interview, ODP dropped the said requirement but refused to reconsider affected cases like mine.

Section 274 of H.R. 1211 seeks to address this injustice.

I would like to request a meeting with you in person to explain to you the situation of my family.



REFUGEE APPLICATION OF HUYNH LONG HOI AND HIS FAMILY,
RELATIVES OF YOUR CONSTITUENT, HAI LONG HUYNH.WE ARE PLEASED TO INFORM YOU THAT HUYNH LONG HOI HAS BEEN
SCHEDULED TO DEPART VIETNAM DIRECTLY FOR THE U.S. ON AUGUST
29, 1995. YOUR CONSTITUENT WILL BE NOTIFIED BY LUTHERAN
SOCIAL SERVICES OF MINNESOTA, A RESETTLEMENT AGENCY, OF THE
EXACT TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS TO THE U.S.HUYNH LONG HOI'S CHILDREN HUYNH LONG THANH, HUYNH THI NGOC
LINH, HUYNH LONG AN, HUYNH LONG YEN, HUYNH THI NGOC HIEN
AND HUYNH THI NGOC THU ARE NOT QUALIFIED TO ACCOMPANY HIM
TO THE U.S. BASED ON HIS OWN REFUGEE APPLICATION BECAUSE
THEY FAILED TO ESTABLISH THEY HAD CONTINUOUSLY RESIDED IN
THE FAMILY HOUSEHOLD, A PREREQUISITE FOR APPROVAL IN THIS
CATEGORY.DOCUMENTS SUBMITTED TO ODP SINCE THE TIME OF THE
APPLICANTS' INTERVIEW HAVE BEEN REVIEWED BY AN IMMIGRATION
OFFICER. THE OFFICER DETERMINED THAT THE DOCUMENTS ARE
INSUFFICIENT TO OVERCOME THE ORIGINAL REFUSAL.THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE HAS RECENTLY ANNOUNCED THAT ODP
REFUGEE CASE COMPOSITION WILL NOW BE LIMITED TO THE
PRINCIPAL APPLICANT, SPOUSE, AND UNMARRIED CHILDREN UNDER
THE AGE OF TWENTY-ONE. SONS AND DAUGHTERS TWENTY-ONE YEARS
OF AGE AND OLDER ARE NO LONGER ELIGIBLE TO ATTEND A REFUGEE
INTERVIEW UNLESS THERE ARE COMPELLING HUMANITARIAN
CIRCUMSTANCES.

SOME DERIVATIVE REFUGEE APPLICANTS WHO ARE OVER THE AGE OF

TWENTY-ONE AND WHO WERE SCHEDULED FOR AN INTERVIEW BEFORE
APRIL 15, 1995 FAILED TO APPEAR FOR INTERVIEW, OR THEIR
APPLICATIONS WERE DENIED OR PLACED ON HOLD. THESE
APPLICANTS ARE BEING GIVEN UNTIL SEPTEMBER 30, 1995 TO
OBTAIN FINAL APPROVAL OF THEIR APPLICATIONS. THEREFORE, IF
HUYNH LONG THANH, HUYNH THI NGOC LINH, HUYNH LONG AN, HUYNH
LONG YEN, HUYNH THI NGOC HIEN AND HUYNH THI NGOC THU ARENOT ABLE TO OVERCOME THE BASIS FOR THE REFUSAL OF THEIR
APPLICATIONS PRIOR TO SEPTEMBER 30, 1995, THEY WILL NO
LONGER BE ELIGIBLE FOR REFUGEE CONSIDERATION. HOWEVER,
ONCE HUYNH LONG HOI BECOMES A U.S. LAWFUL PERMANENT
RESIDENT (PRI), HE WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO FILE SECOND
PREFERENCE IMMIGRANT VISA PETITIONS (FORM I-134) ON BEHALF
OF HIS UNMARRIED CHILDREN. ONCE HE BECOMES A U.S. CITIZEN,
HE WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO FILE THIRD PREFERENCE PETITIONS ON
BEHALF OF ANY OF HIS MARRIED CHILDREN.I HOPE THIS INFORMATION IS HELPFUL TO YOU IN RESPONDING TO
YOUR CONSTITUENT.

I am writing this letter with the "McCain" Family verification Form to request a reconsideration for Huynh Long Thanh and his siblings (file number IV-375457/H40-0234).


My name is Hoi Long Huynh. I am a Former Vietnamese Political Prisoner (file number IV-263425/H40-234/V-110120). I arrived in the United States on August 29, 1995. A year later, my youngest daughter also arrived in the United State. Unfortunately, my other children have not been approved for a resettlement process based on the failure to establish a continuous residence in a family household.


My family's story started since 1975 with the end of Vietnam war. After the war ended, I was put in prison. Half of my children (Huynh Long Thanh, Huynh Long Yen, and Huynh Thi Ngoc Hien) were forced to move in with my parents in Bung Binh - Vietnam. The other half (Huynh Thi Ngoc Linh, Huynh Long An, and Huynh Thi Ngoc Tu) lived with my wife and my mother-in-law in Ben Keo - Vietnam. One year later, my wife remarried. This was a reason that she decided to relocate Huynh Long An to my parents and took Huynh Thi Ngoc Linh and Huynh Thi Ngoc Tu with her. In 1981, I was released from the prison. I resided with Huynh Long Thanh, Huynh Long An, Huynh Long Yen, and Huynh Thi Ngoc Hien. In 1990, I found other part of my family, my other two children (Huynh Thi Ngoc Linh and Huynh Thi Ngoc Tu), who were still living with my ex-wife, and we were allowed to live together under one roof since. My imprisonment was the reason that my children were not able to live with me. They either lived with my parents or my ex-wife while I was in prison.

In 1990, I submitted the application for a political prisoner refugee program. The program **which** the United States Government decided to allow all the former political prisoners and their families' members to find their freedom in the United States. I was very happy to accept a schedule to depart Vietnam directly for the U.S.. However, the happiness is not completed because my children are not allowed to join me. Recently, president Clinton has signed the Amendment (Bill) number 5064 that allows all unmarried children of former political prisoners from Vietnam to be treated as refugees for the purpose of resettlement processing. Therefore, I request a reconsideration of case Huynh Long Thanh and his siblings (file number IV-375457/H40-0234) with the hope that I could be reunited with my children. 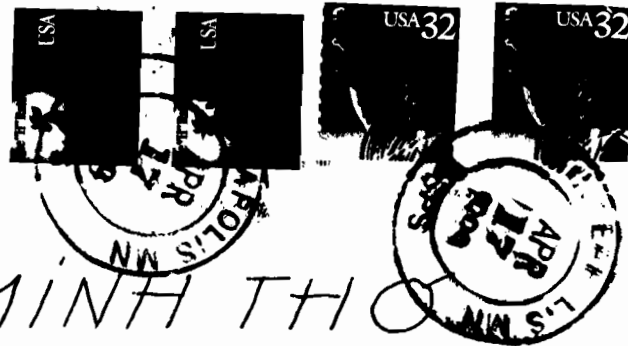
