
I believe that (his, her, their) status under the eligibility guidelines of the Orderly Departure Program (ODP) is affected by the McCain Amendment of the 1997 Foreign Operation Act which restores eligibility to the unmarried over-21 sons and daughters of the former Vietnamese political prisoners.

I request that ODP check the case(s) according to the case numbers provided above and confirm for me that the son(s) or daughters(s) listed above are eligible and part of the group that ODP is now contacting to invite to interview. If a new letter of introduction has already been sent, I would appreciate knowing the date it was sent and to what address in Vietnam. That will help me ensure it arrives.

I appreciate that your office is busy with many cases, but my family and I are equally anxious to ensure that the case of our children be reconsidered under the new law before their eligibility expires.

My name is Huynh, Thanh, a former political prisoner of the Vietnamese communist regime, I am currently residing at

Before April 1975, I was a Sergeant First Class

District, Thua Thien Province, Vietnam

in the armed forces of the Republic of Vietnam. After the communists came to power, I was imprisoned in a re-education camp from 05-15-75 to 11-02-80

Re-education Camp Binh Dien, Thua Thien, Hue, Vietnam

Because of that experience I have been admitted to the United States on in accordance with a subprogram of the ODP program for former political prisoners under a bilateral Agreement between Vietnam and the United States. While I am grateful for the chance to resettle in the United States, my resettlement has been made extremely difficult on account of the fact that the following unmarried children of mine have been rejected for resettlement despite the fact that for many years the unmarried children were permitted to accompany their parents who were former political prisoners.





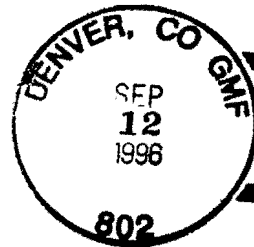
