I believe that their status under the eligibility guidelines of the Orderly Departure Program (ODP) is affected by the McCain Amendment of the 1997 Foreign Operations Act which restores eligibility to the unmarried over-21 sons and daughters of the former Vietnamese political prisoners.

I request that ODP check the cases according to case number provided above and confirm for me that the son and daughter listed above are eligible and part of the group that ODP is now contacting to invite to interview. If a new letter of introduction has already been sent, I would appreciate knowing the date it was sent and to what address in Vietnam. That will help me ensure it arrives.

I appreciate that your office is busy with many cases, but my family and I are equally anxious to ensure that the case of our children be reconsidered under the new law before their eligibility expires.

On behalf of my family, I thank you for your help in this matter.

My name is VAN VAN HUYNH a former political prisoner of the Vietnamese communist regime. I am currently residing at _____ and _____

Before April 1975, I was a Lieutenant in the police Forces of the Republic of Vietnam. After the communists came to power, I was imprisoned in a re-education camp from 6/26/75 to 7/31/1978 at PHU QUOC, LONG GIAO, HAM TAN

Because of that experience I have been admitted to the United States on 04/11/1996 in accordance with a subprogram of the Orderly Departure Program for former political prisoners under a bilateral agreement between Vietnam and the United States. While I am grateful for the chance to resettle in the United States, my resettlement has been made extremely difficult because the following unmarried children of mine have been rejected for resettlement despite the fact that for many years unmarried children were permitted to accompany their parents who were former political prisoners.

- 1) HUYNH MINH MAN SON WAS BORN 1965
 - 2) HUYNH THI THANH NGA DAUGHTER WAS BORN 1967
- They're living at 623/2 CACH MANG THANG 8
SAIGON VIETNAM

Thus, I hope that you can help me so our family could be together again. In particular, may I urge that you give support to Section 595 of the Foreign Operation Appropriation

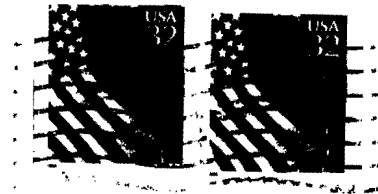

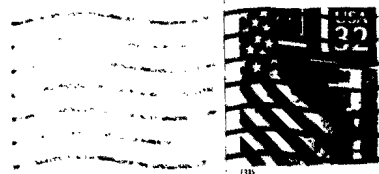
