Dear Ms. Khuc

This is in response to your inquiry of April 19, 1989 regarding the above mentioned ODP applicants.

A Letter of Introduction (LOI) for this case was issued on Sep 25, 1985. As it appears that the LOI was never received we are issuing another.

The applicants should present the LOI to the security office in the area where they live in conjunction with their application for emigration.

Some family members may not be included on the LOI. These would include sons and daughters over 21 years of age or other relatives who do not have their own eligibility, such as a current immigrant visa petition. While they are not eligible for inclusion on the LOI, should they appear for interview with the other eligible family members their dependency and eligibility for the program will be determined at that time.

No further action will be taken on this case until their names appear on a list of names received from the Vietnamese authorities as being eligible for interview by the ODP. The compilation of this list is under the control of the Vietnamese authorities.

If the applicants receive exit permits, passports or other indication that their names have been presented to the U.S. authorities, it should be seen as a good sign. However, they should be advised that it is often months between the notification of the applicants and the actual receipt of the list by the U.S. ODP. ODP must receive this list before they can be considered for interview. Once their names appear on a list the file will be reviewed and, when determined to be documentary complete, their names will be proposed for interview by ODP staff in Vietnam. Any additional documentation will be requested from the anchor relative in the U.S.

Please assure that ODP is kept apprised of any address or family composition changes relating to this case.

Following is an English translation of the enclosed Letter of Introduction :

The above named individuals appear to qualify for resettlement in the United States of America. A final decision as to their eligibility, however, can only be made after they have been interviewed by the appropriate United States immigration or consular officials and have had certain required medical examinations and tests. Approval will depend on the individuals being determined by U.S. officials, prior to the individual's departure from Vietnam, to be in satisfactory health and to meet the requirements of U.S. immigration laws.

Therefore, should these individuals receive exit permission from the Vietnamese Government, we request that they be permitted to undertake in Vietnam all formalities and processing connected with their application to leave Vietnam under the U.S. Orderly Departure Program, including the required medical examinations and tests, and that they be permitted by the Vietnamese authorities to appear before the appropriate United States Government officials to be interviewed.

The qualification of any individual named in this letter for resettlement in the United States may be invalidated in certain situations, including marriage, divorce, the attainment of age of 21, or death.

Enclosed is a Letter of Introduction (LOI) which you should send to your relatives/friends in Vietnam to help them obtain Exit Permits from the Vietnamese authorities. They should present this LOI to their local People's Committee when they apply for Exit Permits.

Please understand that a Letter of Introduction does not guarantee that your relatives/friends will receive exit permission. Getting Exit Permits depends on your relatives/friends and the Vietnamese authorities. Your relatives/friends may have to apply several times.

Please keep us informed of any change in your address, or in the address of the persons named in the Letter of Introduction. Always refer to their file (IV) numbers when you communicate with us.

If your relatives/friends are already in possession of Exit Permits, they should request to be interviewed by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), and should also ask for a medical examination.
