However, my father, the main applicant in our case, was deceased on February 16, 1990 in a pancreatic surgery; then my mother, NGUYEN THI HANH, was killed in a traffic accident on May 20, 1990, left behind three of us, orphans, who are now living in a politically unstable environment without any support.

Without having known of the deaths of our parents, the SON NGOC VU sent us an Interview Notice Letter to ask us to have an interview on August 3, 1990. Three of us, N.D.T. TRANG, N.D. VU and N.D. VY, with the guide of other main applicants in HOS List, were present at SON NGOC VU to be interviewed. But after a short contact, the Chief of the U.S. delegation for Interview and Visa Entry at SON NGOC VU told us that he is not authorized to make any available decision on our special case.

Therefore, with this application to you, I am on behalf of our three orphans, would like to call for your special humanitarian consideration, on our case to be interviewed and departed to the United States under the Ex-Political Prisoner Resettlement Program in the next session of Interview.

Dear Sir/Madam:

I am NGUYEN DUY VU, born on April 24, 1973, Exit Permit No. 295/90-DEC. dated Jan 03, 1990, oldest son of the then political and Ex. Political Prisoner NGUYEN VAN NHI, principal applicant of our family case of request for resettlement in the U.S. under Ex. Political Prisoner category, submit this application to you for calling for your humanitarian action as well as your spirit of love for freedom, as every American citizen's, to allow us - three unfortunate children of recently deceased parents - to be interviewed and departed to the United States of America under the Ex. Political Prisoner Exemption of a special humanitarian concern.

2. Until this point of time, I have not known whichever set of civil records and documents, before and/or after April, 1975 my deceased father had submitted as CDP application to your office; however, after a review of Pre-1975 and Post-1975 records, I reveal the following incompatibility in each set of Exit Permission and records:

No. 289/90-DEC dated Jan 03, 1990; on his Marriage with "make-up" dated Dec. 10, 1988; on his Death Cert. dated Feb 16, 1990 and the year of birth of the father in our - 3 children - birth certificates after 1975; on the Family Registration Form KK4 enlisted July 17, 1979	1. <u>NGUYEN VAN NHI</u> , born on June 17, 1945 appeared on his birth Certificate No. 1114 dated March 15, 1947, officially notarized; 2. <u>NGUYEN VAN NHI</u> , born on June 17, 1945 ARVN SR No. 69/406.977, aspirant of Psychological Warfare Officer, APO 4757, 1st Marine Division 3. <u>NGUYEN VAN NHI</u> , ARVN SR No. 69/206.977, enlisted No. 10, second lieutenant, in the list of Campaign Medal Award, Phung, Sector number 35/TPDY/P.T&T/H.C. dated Oct 25, 1974 4. <u>NGUYEN DUY VU</u> , born on April 24, 1973, he appeared in a draft Birth Certificate without official notarized seal, dated May 10, 1973

(Two separate sets of the details herein are enclosed.)

3. a- Not long before February 11, 1990, my father, the principal applicant as well as Ex-Political Prisoner, had gotten Pancreatic Disease and underwent a Pancreatic Surgery and he died at one o'clock, February 11, 1990. According to medical officials at the hospital there, his Pancreatic Disease had been affected by the lengthy period of living (detained) in various jungle areas.
- b- After 3 months and 9 days, on the way to visit our father's grave, my elder sister NGUYEN DUY THUY TRANG carried my mother NGUYEN THI HANH with a motorcycle, got a traffic accident; my mother died on the spot and my sister was seriously injured, at 9 hours:40 o'clock May 20, 1990.

The two deaths came to my family as a sorrowful catastrophe and left behind the desolated scene our three orphans without any support, one of us has been in Phu Yen province hospital.

c. Certificate of Death No. 03 dated February 16, 1990, named NGUYEN VAN NGHI, my father; certificate of Death No 180 dated May 20, 1990 named NGUYEN THI HANH, my mother; and Certificate of Injury No 512/BVPY dated May 25, 1990, named NGUYEN DUY THUY TRANG, my elder sister. These civil records are enclosed with this application for your consideration.

4. According to my parents when they were alive, late in October 1980, because my father was about to be released from A-30 detention camp, he was permitted to visit my family twice, Their sexual relationship at those periods gave born my younger brother NGUYEN DUY VY, born on July 23, 1981, only 8 months and 17 days after the date out of camp.
5. With all the voluntary assistance of my father's Pre-1975 comrades, including the writer of this application, fund was raised to save my sister from Death God and to give advice in the procedures of justification for any discrepancy in our file, starting from an Act of Verification for Civil Records for my father's year of birth and related civil records.

As far as the 1945 year of birth in my father exit permit, numbered 289/90.DCA; followed by minor NGUYEN DUY VY, is concerned, we have no money to go to Hanoi, the issuance Agency for a legal verification. Please approve and understand this difficulty of our situation.

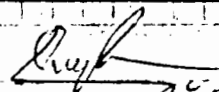
Please love us as meaningfully as you have loved your own children; Please help us - the three orphans - not much a victim of The Vietnam war but much more of the presently dominant regime.
