My name is **Nguyen, Toan Van**, a former political prisoner of the Vietnamese communist regime. I am currently residing at **Van Nuys, CA**

Before April 1975 I was a Captain Regional Force Combat Unit Commander at Binh Tuy province **military # 49/000824**. After the communists came to power, I was imprisoned in a reeducation camp from June 23, 1975 to January 9, 1981 at different locations. From June 23, 1975 to June 21, 1976 I was at Long Giao (Long Khanh Province). Then they moved me to North Vietnam at Hoang Lien Son Province then they put me in Xuan Lai Re-education camp from June 30, 1976 to October 31, 1977. They move me from Xuan Lai Re-education camp to 4th camp up until September 21, 1978. From 4th camp they move me to Vinh Quang in Vinh Phu Province I stay there until my released day which is January 9, 1981.

Because of that experience I have been admitted to the United States on September 13, 1995 in accordance with a subprogram of the Orderly Departure program for former political prisoners under a bilateral agreement between Vietnam and the United States. While I am grateful for the chance to resettle in the United States, my resettlement has been made extremely difficult because the following unmarried children of mine have been rejected for resettlement despite the fact that for many years unmarried children were permitted to accompany their parents who were former political prisoners

These are the name of my unmarried children have been rejected for resettlement

2 **Nguyen, Tuan Tuong** d.o.b **January 23, 1971**
