Subject: Application for being reinterviewed.

Sir:

I have the honor to respectfully request your humanitarian and generosity to consider and assist for my painful case that I was failed by the officer of US INS at an interview in HO CHIMINH city. He determined that I didn't meet the definition in section 101 (a)(42) of the INA. While I only missed a settlement certificate of new economic zone at the time of interview.

This is my statement forwarding to you for consideration, as follows:

As a former officer of the ARVN grade Captain SN A1403760, unit H1st RMC Engineer branch. I have associated with the US government policy from 3/1954 to 4/1975 (over 18 years). During that period I have attended two improving courses under US government auspices, and graduated two diplomas at Fort Belvoir (IOBC) and Fort-Lee (ISO) in Va, USA.

Due to result of my Pre-1975 association with the U.S after 4/1975 I have to face to severe difficulties, suffered extreme persecutions such as:

- obliged to enter into Re-education camp from April 3rd 1975 to August 30th 1976.
- After my release, I was forced to settle to new economical-area in central Highlands of Dalat Vietnam by the local authority order. It means

that I was decided the new residence, oppressed to labor, separated from religious activities, deprived all citizen right.

- My children were prevented from attending school in high level.
- Our house which my wife is owner was confiscated and put in NAMF.

Besides, I was always requested for my past activities with U.S in the war time (My document has been attached all relating evidences).

Recently, based on the admendment of LAUTENBERG and according to the answers for an interview between the ODP director (Mr ELDON HAGER) and the chief of USC (Mr NAM-LỘC) on Aug-1997 at Ca, USA, I think I have a chance to meet enough ODP eligibility for settlement as refugee.

Therefore, by this letter I would like you to take my case into reconsideration so my application can be reviewed and obtained the admission to U.S under H-O Program.

I hope you will be willing to give me your favor and I am looking forward the good result will come to me soon.

favourable reconsideration for my claim.

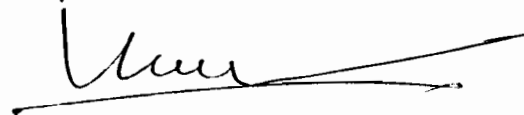
