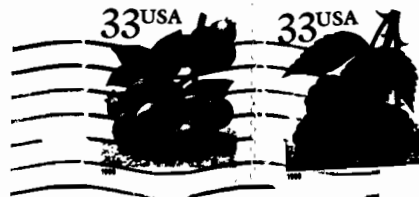
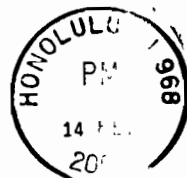

Letter requests the humane policy to sponsor my only son in Vietnam to reunite family in United States as refugee.

Dear Sir,

My name is Nguyen Long Xuan SS#

DOB 4/12/1939 in Vietnam.

Residing at

In this letter I would like to ask you please consider my following case to help me out. Before 4/30/1975 I was a captain in Army Force Republic of Vietnam in Saigon. On 4/30/1975 I was put in Communist Camp at Northern Hanoi. After 5 years I have been ill treatment so much that my two legs get paralyzed. And then I got a released; my former wife divorced me, and she left three children for me to take care. I have to face multi difficulties for a war prisoner to raise three children at that time!

Almost ten years, we waiting for help. On August 1994, my family included five people; we went to the United State as Refugees under the humane policy of U.S.A. Government. But my eldest son named Nguyen Xuan Phu DOB 1969 still in Vietnam.

Reason: When making paper work to go to the U.S.A. at Nguyen Du St. in Saigon. We heard that any children reach 21 years old not legal to go. But he has to wait when the parent settle down in the American then makes sponsor for him. As matter of fact, my son name as in the application form and had finger printed, and pictures as well to turn into Phu Nhuan District. We also sent these document to Embassy in Bangkok 7 times (at that time the VN government did not have official office yet) We believe that our document included 6 persons of my family remain in ODP file at Bangkok.

Dear Sir,

We have been in the United States more than 4 years. We would like very much to sponsor my son s family. But we are not able at all. Because my two daughters they are married and have children. They work and receive low income. So that they also receive welfare assistance to take care their children. Myself after five years being torture in camp I got the PostTraumatic Stress Disorder and receive the SSI (attached 2 Doctor cert.) Therefore my wife has to take care of my youngest 16 years old son and me. Who goes to High School at Kaimuki.

We very happy to hear that the program of Mr. Mc.Cain Case is helping the HO s children whom are 21 years old to reunite the family as refugee.

I respectfully ask your high humanity to consider my son s case and sponsor them to resettle in the United States as refugee.

My son s family includes:

1-My son Ngyuen Xuan Phu DOB 1969

His job is dressmaker in Industry Co.

2-Wife Hoang Huong Thanh DOB 1970

Her job is Dressmaker and Embroider

3-Son Nguyen Xuan Nhuan. Under 4years old

Residing at 2B Nguyen thi Huynh F-8 Quan Phu Nhuan.

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The recently-enacted "McCain Amendment" to the Foreign Operations Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 1997 provides that the children of former Vietnamese reeducation center detainees are to be considered refugees of special humanitarian concern and may be eligible for resettlement in the US if they meet the following criteria:

- (1) The child in Vietnam —
 - (A) is the son or daughter of a qualified national; and
 - (B) is 21 years of age or older; and
 - (C) was unmarried as of the date of acceptance of his/her parent's resettlement under the Orderly Departure Program.
- (2) The term 'qualified national' in paragraph (1) means a national of Vietnam who —
 - (A) (i) was formerly interned in re-education in Vietnam; or
(ii) is the widow or widower of an individual formerly interned in re-education in Vietnam;
and
 - (B) (i) qualified for refugee processing under the ODP re-education subprogram; and
(ii) on or after April 1, 1995, is accepted —
 - (I) for resettlement in the U.S. as a refugee; or
 - (II) for admission to the U.S. as an immigrant under the Orderly Departure Program.

ODP has reviewed your application and determined that you do not qualify for refugee consideration under the McCain Amendment for the reason(s) indicated below:

- ☐ The principal applicant was approved for refugee status or the issuance of an immigrant visa prior to April 1, 1995. His family members are therefore not covered under the terms of the Amendment.
- ☐ The principal applicant withdrew his refugee application. He and his family members are therefore no longer eligible for refugee consideration and are not covered under the terms of the Amendment.
- ☒ The principal applicant's children were lawfully married at the time of the principal applicant's approval for resettlement in the US. They are therefore not covered under the terms of the Amendment.
- ☐ The principal applicant was approved as a refugee under a category not covered by the Amendment.
- ☐ The principal applicant's children were denied at interview as their relationship to the principal applicant was not established. They are therefore not covered under the terms of the Amendment, unless they can submit sufficient evidence to establish the claimed relationships.
- ☐ Other: Once you become a US citizen you can fill an
immigrant visa petition

NGUYEN XUAN PHU. YOU WROTE ON BEHALF OF YOUR
CONSTITUENT, NGUYEN XUAN LONG.

YOUR CONSTITUENT HAS REQUESTED THAT HIS SON IN VIETNAM
BE CONSIDERED FOR REFUGEE STATUS UNDER THE "MCCAIN
AMENDMENT." PLEASE ADVISE YOUR CONSTITUENT THAT THE
"MCCAIN AMENDMENT" EXTENDS REFUGEE CONSIDERATION TO THE
OVER 21-YEAR-OLD CHILDREN OF FORMER RE-EDUCATION CENTER
DETAINEES WHO WERE APPROVED FOR REFUGEE STATUS ON OR
AFTER APRIL 1, 1995, PROVIDED THEY WERE UNMARRIED AT
THE TIME OF THEIR PARENT'S REFUGEE INTERVIEW. SINCE
YOUR CONSTITUENT WAS APPROVED FOR REFUGEE STATUS ON
FEBRUARY 8, 1994, HIS SON IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR REFUGEE
CONSIDERATION.

ONCE YOUR CONSTITUENT BECOMES A U.S. CITIZEN, HE MAY
FILE A THIRD PREFERENCE (F3) IMMIGRANT VISA PETITION
(FORM I-130) WITH THE IMMIGRATION AND NATURALIZATION
SERVICE (INS) FOR HIS MARRIED SON IN VIETNAM. THE
PETITION, ONCE APPROVED, WILL BE STORED AT THE NATIONAL
VISA CENTER (NVC) UNTIL THE APPLICANT IS ELIGIBLE FOR
AN IMMIGRANT VISA INTERVIEW. VISAS ARE PRESENTLY
AVAILABLE FOR APPLICANTS WHOSE THIRD PREFERENCE
IMMIGRANT VISA PETITIONS WERE FILED PRIOR TO JUNE 22,
1995. WE ARE MAILING DIRECTLY TO YOUR CONSTITUENT
INFORMATION ON FILING IMMIGRANT VISA PETITIONS WITH THE
INS.

TO YOUR CONSTITUENT.
