My name is Quy Ngoc Pham, a former political prisoner of the Vietnamese Communist regime. I am currently residing at Tampa, Florida.

Before April 1975, I was a district commissioner of the Vietnam people party of Nghia Hinh district, Quang Ngai Province under the Republic of Vietnam regime.

After the Communist came to power, I was imprisoned in a re-education camp from Oct. 13, 1975 to Jan. 22, 1981.

Because of that experience I have been admitted to the United States on Nov. 22, 1995 in accordance with the sub-program of ODP program for former political prisoners under a bilateral agreement between Vietnam and the United States.

While I am grateful for the chance to resettle in the United States, my resettlement has been made extremely difficult on account of the fact that the following unmarried children of mine have been rejected for resettlement despite the fact that for many years the unmarried children were permitted

to accompany their parents who were  
former political prisoners.

This I hope that you can help me so  
that our family could be together again.

In particular, may I urge that you give  
your support to section 595 of the Foreign Operations

July 26, 1996. The bill will be considered by the  
Conference Committee in early September 1996.

By making sure that this section remains in  
the final Act, you will be helping many families  
of former Vietnamese political prisoners who are  
in the same sad situation as mine.

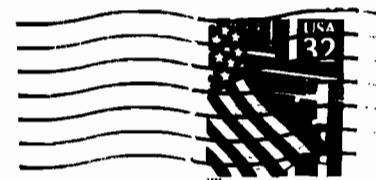
