Dear Mrs. Wagner:

My cousin, Mr. Pham Ta Tu, is a resident of Vietnam and a former major in the South Vietnamese Army. He previously had worked for the South Vietnamese Government and as an Advisor to the United States Armed Forces for twenty years prior to the fall of the South Vietnamese Government.

Mr. Tu desires assistance for himself and his family in immigrating to the United States under the Orderly Departure Program. Accordingly, Mr. Tu has prepared the enclosed "Request for Immigration to the United States under the O.D.P." I ask that you please consider my cousin's request.

While working as an Advisor to the U.S. Armed Forces, he was under the supervision of Lt. Col. O'Neill, United States Army. When the North Vietnamese Government overran South Vietnam in 1975, Mr. Tu was held prisoner in the re-education camp. He remained at the re-education camp for eight years and eight months and was finally released in February 1984.

Mr. Tu kindly asks your assistance to accept his application to join my family in the United States. If there are any additional documents which will assist in the processing of his request, I will be happy to provide them. Also, my husband and I will gladly execute an Affidavit of Support on behalf of my cousin, if necessary.

My cousin and I thank you for your assistance.
