This is in response to your inquiry of JUN 4, 89 regarding the above mentioned ODP applicants.

This case is based on PHAM VAN CHAN's 5 years in reeducation.

Cases of former political prisoners who spent time in reeducation are being reviewed in order of the time spent in reeducation. Given the large number of this type of case on file with the ODP it is impossible to determine when this case might be reviewed. If, at the time of review, it meets all ODP requirements a Letter of Introduction (LOI) will be issued. If further documentation or explanation is required we will contact the U.S. sponsor or the principal applicant in Vietnam directly.


If anyone in the U.S. is eligible to file an IV petition for the individuals on this case and has not done so already, it is recommended that they do so. Our experience has been that the Vietnamese react more favorably to requests for emigration for cases of family reunification. Attached is information on the filing of petitions.

There will be no further action taken on this case until it is eligible for review.

If the applicants on this case should appear on a list of names presented by the Vietnamese indicating that they will be available for interview, their eligibility for the program will be considered at that time.

Please assure that ODP is kept apprised of any address or family composition changes relating to this case.

I. ADDITIONAL REMARKS

Graduated from the Dalat National Military School (class 23/1966-1970) and promoted to the rank of 2nd Lieutenant, I gave my service preferral to the 1st Infantry Division based at proximity of the DMZ, to be appointed as Company Deputy Commander.

Commanding my unit in the well-known Lam Son 719 Operation, I had fought valiantly in spite of a wound at my left clavicle. However overrun by superiority in number, I was captured and made prisoner of war to be sent to the Yen Bay 371 POW camp (north Vietnam).

After 5 years and a half of detention I was released on Aug 24, 1976.

The readaptation to this new surrounding appears to be hard, chiefly when I have been constantly placed under strict control and subject to political discrimination.

My dearest expectations have been to seek assistance with an immigration to the United States. Please be so kind as to benevolently review our case for an eventual approval.

I will gratefully appreciate if an IV number was assigned to my file and an LOI issued to help document our petition for exit permit.



