I undersigned : **PHAM VAN HOI**, born in 1951, residing at 130/14 Le Quoc Hung St., Ward 12, District 4, Ho Chi Minh City.

I am a Diver trained by the **U.S** at **SUBIC BAY, PHILIPPINES** Diving School. Employed in the Republic of Vietnam until April 30, 1975. I did not report to declare, thus I was re-educated 3 days. In 1980 I took flight overseas and arrested for re-ed. at Giong Trom, Ben Tre for 18 months.

In 1982 I was released home to date. I could not apply for any employment. My family wishes so much to immigrate for resettlement in the United States so that my two sons may have a better future.

While awaiting for favorable consideration and assistance, I am extremely grateful.
