We can take no further action on the correspondence you have sent to the US Orderly Departure Program for the reason indicated below:

- ☐ The enclosed visa petitions (form I-130) have not been approved by the US Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS). Please send or take them to the nearest INS office for approval. INS will forward the petitions to ODP once they are approved.
- ☐ ODP has not received approved immigrant visa petitions (form I-130) from INS for the relatives you mention. As petitions are usually received by ODP within six months of the filing date, you may wish to check with the INS office where the petitions were filed to confirm that they were approved and sent to the American Embassy in Bangkok.
- ☐ ODP records indicate that you may have previously filed immigrant visa petitions (form I-130) for:

Since ODP has not yet received these petitions, and due to the time that has elapsed, you should file replacement petitions with the nearest INS office as soon as possible. Any evidence of the previous filing, including receipts for fees paid or approval notices from INS (form I-171 or I-797), should be submitted with the new petitions. A copy of this letter may also be submitted as evidence that ODP has not received the petitions. If INS is able to verify the filing date of the original petitions, the replacement petitions will receive the original priority date and additional filing fees will not be charged.

- ☐ Your relatives will not need the money or airline ticket you have sent to us. Air passage will be arranged by the International Organization for Migration (IOM) once your relatives have been interviewed and approved for resettlement in the US. You will receive detailed instructions on how to proceed if payment for airfare is required.
- ☐ ODP does not forward mail to Vietnam. You should mail your correspondence to Vietnam directly from the US.
- ☒ The affidavit you sent is a photocopy. ODP requires an original affidavit of relationship (AOR) with an original signature and an original notary stamp to establish a file and process your family's case. Please note that ODP will open files based on AOR's only for those cases involving unaccompanied minor children in the US who are under the age of 21.
- ☐ We are not able to accept applications on behalf of persons living outside of Vietnam. Persons residing outside of Vietnam who wish to go to the US should consult the nearest US Consulate or Embassy concerning their eligibility for immigrant or refugee status.

- ☒ If you entered the US as a refugee and are not yet a US citizen, you are eligible to file a refugee relative petition (form I-730/visa 937) with INS on behalf of your spouse and unmarried children under the age of 21.
