I believe that (his, her, their) status under the eligibility guidelines of the Orderly Departure Program (ODP) is affected by the McCain Amendment of the 1997 Foreign Operation Act which restores eligibility to the unmarried over-21 sons and daughters of the former Vietnamese political prisoners.

I request that ODP check the case(s) according to case number provided above and confirm for me that the son(s) or daughter(s) listed above are eligible and part of the group that ODP is now contacting to invite to interview. If a new letter of introduction has already been sent, I would appreciate knowing the date it was sent and to what address in Vietnam. That will help me ensure it arrives.

I appreciate that your office is busy with many cases, but my family and I are equally anxious to ensure that the case of our children be reconsidered under the new law before their eligibility expires.

On behalf of my family, I thank you for your help in this matter.

Dear Sir/Madam:

This is in response to your recent inquiry addressed to the U.S. Orderly Departure Program (ODP) requesting expedited processing of the above mentioned case because of Thanh's medical condition. The medical documents which were attached to your inquiry do not include sufficient information to determine if the medical condition described meets ODP's emergency processing criteria as established by the U.S. Department of State. A comprehensive physician's report which indicates the nature of the illness, prognosis and suggested treatment will be required before such a determination can be made. The medical documents must be both original and recent if they are to serve as a basis for considering this case for expedited processing. English translations should be attached for all Vietnamese medical documents submitted.

Comments: the document you sent was a working ability Survey done as Aug 76 - it is too old for our purpose

Once we receive these documents we will forward them for review by medical officers of the International Organization for Migration (IOM) who will determine whether the medical condition described meets the medical criteria for emergency processing. In general, an eligible ODP applicant will qualify for an expedited interview and movement to the United States if that person has a potentially life-threatening condition that cannot be treated in Vietnam. The condition must also be expected to respond to treatment available in the United States with a good prognosis for recovery and survival. Chronic conditions that can be managed in Vietnam do not meet this criteria nor do those that are directly associated with aged and frail individuals.

In the event that this case meets these criteria and qualifies for expedited processing, the U.S. sponsor will also be required to submit original notarized Affidavits of Support (Form I-134) on behalf of each of the applicants on this case. Supporting documentation such as copies of federal tax returns, letters from employers, or bank statements must be attached as well. These documents, along with the medical documents requested above, should be forwarded as soon as possible to the ODP marked ATTN: MEDICAL COORDINATOR, COMMUNICATIONS UNIT.

Please note that even if the patient's condition is determined not to meet the emergency processing criteria outlined above, having medical information and recent Affidavits of Support in the file will assist the ODP in the routine processing of this case once it is scheduled to be reviewed for an interview.
