I am writing and asking for your generous reconsideration of my two unmarried children, whose names, dates of birth and address are listed below.

Please be informed that my two children and I were interviewed on March 10, 1995, and that our refugee applications were denied by an officer of the United States Orderly Departure Program in Ho Chi Minh City, due to his judgement that the documentation I presented was not genuine.

After making necessary appeals by myself and my brother, Vo Van Lit, in the United States, I was reinterviewed on April 17, 1996 and accepted for resettlement in the United States under Section 207 of the Immigration & Nationality Act. Unfortunately, the names of my two children listed above were deleted from my interview list for reinterview due to their passing of over 21 years of age.

I believe that my two children's status under the eligibility guidelines of the Orderly Departure Program is affected by the McCain Amendment of the 1997 Foreign Operations Act which reinstates eligibility of the unmarried children of over 21 years of age of the former Vietnamese political prisoners.

I respectfully request ODP check my children's cases according to case number provided above and confirm me that my two unmarried children, VO TAN HONG and VO THI HONG-THAO, are eligible and part of the group that ODP is now contacting to propose for interview. If a new Letter of Introduction has already been sent, I would appreciate having a copy of this letter in order to know the date it was sent and to what address in Viet-Nam. That will help me ensure it arrives.

I appreciate that your office is busy with many cases, but my fa-

mily and I are equally anxious to ensure that the case my two unmarried children be reconsidered under the new law before their eligibility expires.

On behalf of my two children and myself, I wish to extend to you and your staff my heart felt appreciation for your reconsideration of this humanitarian matter.


