community groups participating who work directly with Southeast Asian communities.

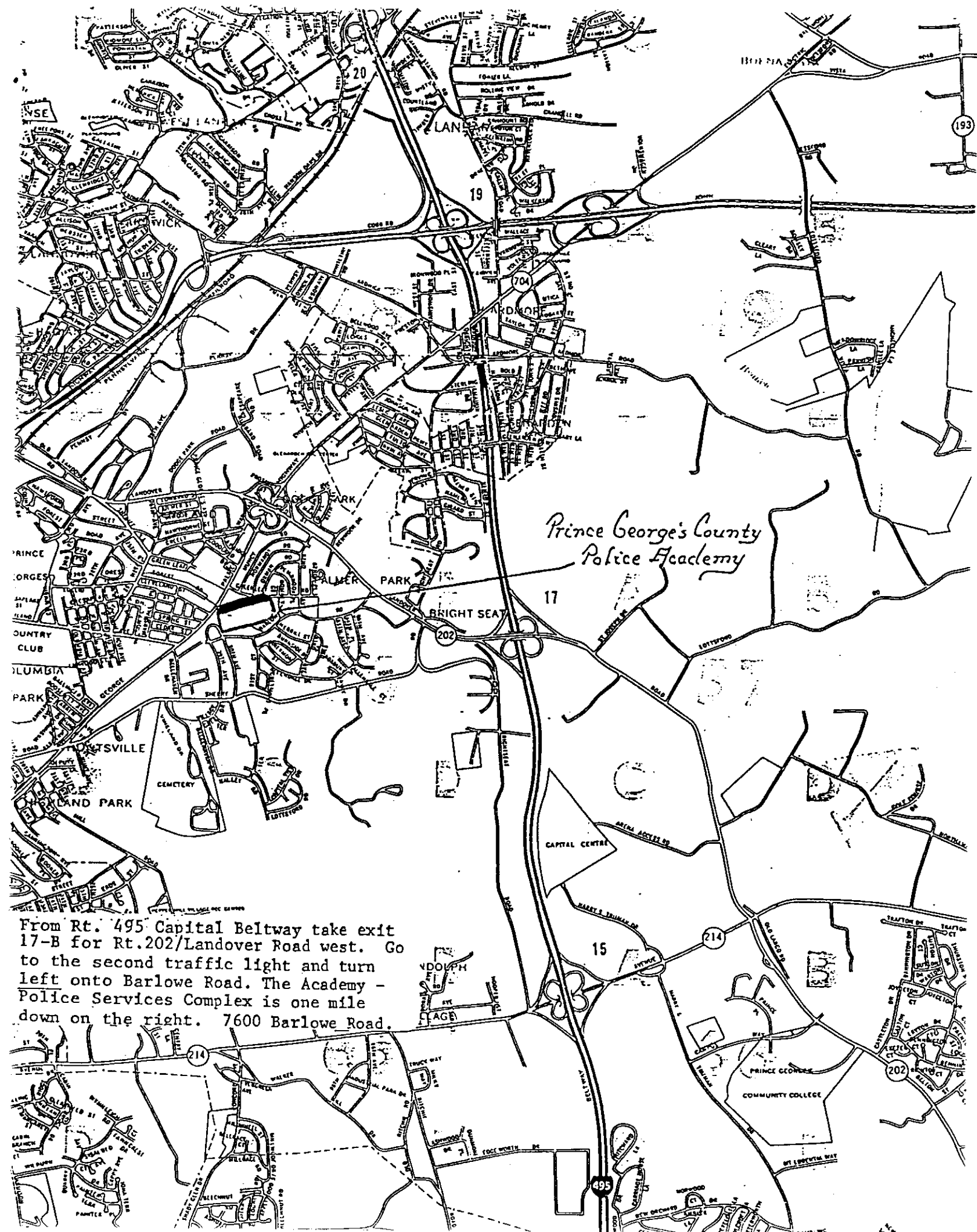
