

Suggested Documents to be Taken to Your Interview
When Scheduled with the U.S. Interview Team in Ho Chi Minh

It is not required that you have all of these documents: the purpose of this list is only to suggest the kinds of things that might be useful in processing your family case.

1. Child's old U.S. passport; U.S. Consular Report of Birth or Certificate of Birth Abroad.
2. Copy of child's original Birth Certificate which was registered at the time of birth.
3. Parent's Marriage Certificate and/or Cohabitation Certificate.
4. Mother's U.S. Permanent Resident Alien Card (Green Card); Notice of Approval of I-129F or I-130 petition.
5. All family registers since the date of birth of the child until present.
6. Letters from the father.
7. Official documents of the father such as ID cards, passport, birth certificate, travel orders, letters from the U.S. Government, ration cards, pay receipts, dog tags, etc.
8. Other pre- and post-1975 documents of the child, such as school records, medical or religious documents, Pearl S. Puch Foundation papers, etc.
9. Old photographs of child's father, by himself or together with the child and/or with the child's mother.
10. Old photographs of child together with his natural or foster mother since his birth until now.
11. Recent photographs of the child.
12. Any documents to verify employment with an American organization of a relative applying with the child.
13. Birth certificate, pre-1975 and post-1975 Identity Cards, Marriage Certificate and one photograph of each person accompanying the child.
14. Photocopies of exit permits if they have been received.

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
