Persons desiring to immigrate to the United States are, by U.S. Immigration laws, divided into two general categories: (a) those who may enter the U.S. as permanent residents, without any restriction based on numbers of persons (Immediate Relative Petitions) and (b), those who are restricted by an annual number of persons who may enter as permanent residents (Preference Petitions). Preference Petitions are processed according to Department of State issued "Priority Dates". Please note that these restrictions apply to immigrant visa applicants in all countries, not just to the ODP.

Receipt of a visa petition assures that your case(s) will be reviewed by the ODP for issuance of a Letter of Introduction (LOI) if one has not already been issued. The large volume of petitions received by this office, however, has resulted in the establishment of a priority system of review and no predictions can be made as to when an LOI will be issued, even for a current petition.

Only visa petitions which have priority dates which are current or near current are eligible for LOI review. The term "current" means that the beneficiary is eligible to enter the U.S. as an immigrant. A non-current visa petition may be reviewed for an LOI if the beneficiary is a minor child or if there is other qualifying criteria such as reeducation camp internment or close association with U.S. policies and programs in Vietnam prior to 1975. If at the time of review for LOI any further documents or information is required, you will be notified.

The type(s) of petition(s) you filed ~~is~~/are:

✓ Immediate Relative - filed by a U.S. citizen on behalf of his or her spouse, unmarried sons or daughters under the age of 21 or parents - always current.

       First Preference - filed by a U.S. citizen on behalf of his or her sons or daughters over the age of 21 - presently current.

       Fourth Preference - filed by a U.S. citizen on behalf of his or her married sons or daughters - presently current.

       Second Preference - filed by a Permanent Resident Alien on behalf of his or her spouse or unmarried sons or daughters - petitions filed prior to                      are now current.

       Fifth Preference - filed by a U.S. citizen on behalf of his or her siblings - petitions filed prior to                      are now current.

       Visas 93 - filed by a Parolee on behalf of his or her spouse or unmarried sons or daughters under the age of 21 - always current.

       K1 Petition - filed by a U.S. citizen on behalf of his or her fiancé(e) - always current.

Please note that receipt of a petition and issuance of an LOI are only preliminary steps in the ODP process. Movement from Vietnam is always contingent upon the Vietnamese authorities taking favorable action on your relatives application for emigration and allowing them access to the ODP.

Cases that are made eligible to the ODP for interview in Ho Chi Minh City are under constant review, regardless of the type of petition. If your relatives' names appear on a list of people who the Vietnamese will allow to be interviewed by the ODP their case will be reviewed and you will be notified if any further action is necessary.

Please be sure to refer to the IV number listed above on any further correspondence regarding this case and notify the ODP of any address changes either in the U.S. or in Vietnam.
