Dear Khuc Minh Tho:

REGARDING THE USE OF GENETIC TESTING IN ODP CASES: First, please be advised that ALL ODP applicants, including refugee applicants, who request genetic testing to establish claimed parentage are required to pay all costs incurred for such testing. Neither ODP nor any other US government agency will cover these costs. For additional information regarding the use of genetic testing, please see the attached information (in both English and Vietnamese).

381928/RF1-990 Children of Dang Van Bin: The case has been represented to INS based on documents provided in a letter of appeal from family in the US. The applicants will be informed of INS' decision.

383550/RF1-1084 Step-children of Le Van Ro: The applicants were over-18 when their mother married Le Van Ro. Under US law they can not be considered legal step-children and are therefore not qualified under McCain.

383313/R19-2106 Child of Nguyen Cuu My: INS determined the applicant was not divorced until after Mr. Nguyen's approval.

380395/H39-783 Children of Nguyen Ngoc Muc: The applicants were denied because INS determined the release certificate and marriage certificate of the already resettled principal applicant to be fake, as well as the birth certificates of the children. An SRV investigation of the already departed principal applicant's re-education documents, at the request of INS, determined the documents were in accordance with the V61 claim. The case was represented to INS with a copy of the SRV response. INS determined "no action required". JVA will represent the case based on school records submitted by the applicants and will ask for clarification as to the relevance of release certificates and marriage certificates of already departed parents.

382226/R14-553 Child of Tao Tai: The applicant presented a marriage certificate dated Feb97 yet had a child born Mar96. INS found the HK to be inconsistent with the norm. The applicant submitted an appeal letter, this time with a marriage certificate dated Dec95. INS upheld the original denial.

382827/RP1-1466 Child of Tran Suoi: The anchor has requested DNA testing. DNA information will be sent to the anchor.

380799/H31-1031 Children of Tran Dinh Dien: After the interview in Jan97, INS referred the case to the SRV for investigation of the documentation. To date, the SRV has not responded. In Apr97, JVA represented the case to INS accompanied with verifications obtained by the applicants. INS decided to wait for a response from the SRV before reconsidering the case.

383227/H38-116 Children of Tran Huu Moc: INS determined the applicants submitted questionable birth certificates and identification documents. The case was represented to INS for reconsideration. The original denial was upheld on 26Aug97.

DNA Testing Instructions

US Orderly Departure Program (ODP)

US sponsors of ODP applicants who are denied immigrant visas under §221(g) of the U.S. Immigration and Nationality Act (or denied derivative refugee status) for failure to establish their relationship may request DNA blood testing when all other means to verify the relationship have been exhausted. Blood samples are taken from the US sponsor, the Vietnamese applicant and, as needed, the applicant's other parents or siblings. The results are analyzed by an approved laboratory in the US. A US consular or INS officer will review the results and either approve the visa application or uphold the original denial. This test is highly accurate in determining blood relationships.

Applicants or their US sponsors are responsible for the entire cost of the procedure to be paid in advance, and there is no guarantee the case will be approved after the test. Testing must be performed by an American Association of Blood Banks (AABB) approved DNA testing laboratory in the US (see attached list). Blood from the Vietnamese applicant must be drawn in Vietnam by staff of Cho Ray Hospital in coordination with ODP. Steps for sponsor-initiated DNA testing are:

- The sponsor contacts one of the approved laboratories on the attached list and arranges for a pre-paid specimen collection kit to be sent to ODP at:

- The sponsor has a blood sample drawn as directed by the AABB approved laboratory.
- The sponsor and applicant are responsible for the following fees:
 1. Cost of the collection kit, testing procedures and for shipping the collection kit to Bangkok and from Ho Chi Minh City to the lab (payable to the lab).
 2. Blood collection fee (equivalent to US\$ 10) and photo fee (equivalent to US\$ 5). Pay to Cho Ray Hospital at the time of blood drawing, in local currency.
- The sponsor instructs the lab to send a Federal Express pre-paid mailing envelope to ODP along with the testing kit.
- Upon receipt of the specimen collection kit from the US laboratory, ODP will schedule an appointment to collect blood. The applicant will be informed of the time and place of the appointment date by telegram. Be sure ODP has the applicant's correct mailing address in Vietnam.

- On the scheduled date the applicant will be required to provide the following before the sample is collected:

1. Socialist Republic of Vietnam (SRV) passport
2. SRV Identification Card
3. Original birth certificate or official extract
4. The equivalent of US \$15 for collection and photo fees (Pay to Cho Ray Hospital in local currency).

If the applicant cannot attend on the appointed day, he/she should contact the ODP office in Ho Chi Minh City at:

- An ODP staff member will witness the collection of the sample. Photos will be taken to record the identity of the applicant.
- An ODP official will send the sample directly to the US lab using Federal Express mail service.

After analysis, the US lab will forward the completed results directly to ODP. A US consular or INS officer will review the results. If the results conclusively establish the requisite relationship, and all other ineligibilities have been resolved, the 221(g) refusal will be overcome. If the results do not conclusively show the requisite relationship exists, the visa will be denied. ODP will notify the sponsor and applicant by mail of the final decision.

Hướng dẫn thử nghiệm máu theo di truyền học DNA

Chương trình ra đi có trật tự Hoa Kỳ (ODP)

Những người bảo trợ tại Hoa Kỳ của các đương đơn ODP đã bị từ chối cấp thị thực di dân (hay diện tị nạn bị từ chối) theo khoản 221(g) của Luật Di Trú và Nhập Tịch Hoa Kỳ và không chứng minh được mối liên hệ có thể yêu cầu được thử nghiệm máu theo di truyền học DNA nếu không còn cách nào khác để chứng minh mối liên hệ này. Các mẫu máu được lấy từ người bảo trợ tại Hoa Kỳ, đương đơn người Việt Nam và nếu cần, cha mẹ hoặc anh chị em của đương đơn. Các kết quả sẽ được phân tích bởi một phòng thí nghiệm được chấp thuận tại Hoa Kỳ. Một viên chức lãnh sự hoặc di trú Hoa Kỳ sẽ xem xét các kết quả này và chấp thuận đơn xin thị thực hoặc giữ nguyên quyết định từ chối ban đầu.

Các đương đơn hoặc những người bảo trợ tại Hoa Kỳ có trách nhiệm phải trả trước mọi phí tổn cho việc thử nghiệm này và không có gì bảo đảm là hồ sơ sẽ được chấp thuận sau khi việc thử nghiệm đã hoàn tất. Việc thử nghiệm sẽ do một phòng thí nghiệm máu theo di truyền học DNA đã được chấp thuận thuộc Hiệp Hội các Ngân Hàng Máu Hoa Kỳ (AABB) thực hiện tại Hoa Kỳ (xin xem danh sách đính kèm). Máu của đương đơn người Việt Nam sẽ được nhân viên Bệnh Viện Chợ Rẫy lấy tại Việt Nam với sự cộng tác của ODP. Việc thử nghiệm máu theo di truyền học DNA do người bảo trợ đề xướng sẽ được thực hiện như sau:

- Người bảo trợ liên lạc với một trong các phòng thí nghiệm đã được chấp thuận có tên trong danh sách đính kèm và sắp xếp để nhận túi xét nghiệm máu đã trả tiền trước gửi đến ODP theo địa chỉ sau:

- Người bảo trợ sẽ được lấy máu theo sự hướng dẫn của một phòng thí nghiệm đã được chấp thuận thuộc Hiệp Hội các Ngân Hàng Máu Hoa Kỳ.
- Người bảo trợ và đương đơn có trách nhiệm trả các chi phí sau đây:
 1. Phí tổn cho túi xét nghiệm máu, các thủ tục: thử nghiệm và việc chuyển tới này đến Bangkok và từ Thành Phố Hồ Chí Minh đến phòng thí nghiệm (trả tiền cho phòng thí nghiệm).
 2. Phí tổn lấy máu (tương đương 10 Mỹ kim) và phí tổn chụp hình (tương đương 5 Mỹ kim). Xin trả bằng tiền Việt Nam cho Bệnh Viện Chợ Rẫy lúc lấy máu.
- Người bảo trợ yêu cầu phòng thí nghiệm gửi cho ODP một bao thư gửi cấp tốc đã trả trước bưu phí cùng với túi xét nghiệm máu.

- Khi nhận được tờ xét nghiệm máu của phòng thí nghiệm gửi đến từ Hoa Kỳ, ODP sẽ sắp xếp một buổi hẹn để lấy máu. Dương đơn sẽ được thông báo về ngày giờ và địa điểm của buổi hẹn bằng điện tín. Phải chắc chắn là ODP có địa chỉ liên lạc chính xác của dương đơn tại Việt Nam.
- Vào ngày đã ấn định, dương đơn sẽ được yêu cầu xuất trình các giấy tờ sau đây trước khi lấy máu:
 1. Hộ chiếu Cộng Hòa Xã Hội Chủ Nghĩa Việt Nam
 2. Chứng minh nhân dân do Cộng Hòa Xã Hội Chủ Nghĩa Việt Nam cấp
 3. Bản chính giấy khai sinh hoặc trích lục khai sinh
 4. Số tiền tương đương 15 Mỹ kim cho chi phí lấy máu và chụp hình Dữ trữ bằng tiền Việt Nam cho Bệnh Viện Chợ Rẫy

- Một nhân viên ODP sẽ chứng kiến việc lấy máu. Sẽ có chụp hình để lập lý lịch của dương đơn.
- Viên chức ODP sẽ gửi mẫu máu trực tiếp về phòng thí nghiệm tại Hoa Kỳ qua dịch vụ thư cấp tốc.

Sau khi phân tích, phòng thí nghiệm tại Hoa Kỳ sẽ chuyển các kết quả đã hoàn tất trực tiếp đến ODP. Một viên chức lãnh sự hoặc di trú sẽ cầu xét các kết quả. Nếu các kết quả chứng minh có liên hệ như yêu cầu và những điều bất hợp lệ khác đều được giải quyết thì quyết định bác bỏ theo khoản 221(g) sẽ được hủy bỏ. Nếu các kết quả không chứng minh được mối liên hệ như yêu cầu thì thị thực sẽ không được cấp. ODP sẽ có thư báo cho người bảo trợ và dương đơn biết quyết định cuối cùng.

Dear Mr. Hager:

Thank you for your helpful and informative letter of July 29, 1997, which responded to my letter of July 7th. I just returned from a month long trip to Vietnam and just now have the opportunity to answer your letter.

Our Association understands that the JVA can only make suggestions about specific cases that we bring to your attention. We appreciate that INS wields broad discretionary power in determining the validity of relationships and in adjudicating refugee cases in general.

Our Association remains concerned with the implementation of the McCain amendment, which restored eligibility to the adult unmarried children of the former Vietnamese political prisoners under the HO subprogram of ODP. I am sure you know that this amendment is likely to be extended through September, 1998, with additional clarifications we had sought regarding the processing of the over-21 children of widows and of the over-21 children of refugees who immigrated to the US at the convenience of the US government. These changes are in the State Department Authorization Bill which is expected to go to conference soon after Labor Day.

We plan to meet soon with Ms. Mitzi Schroeder to follow up on our concerns about the status of the McCain program. We hope to work with ICMC and ODP to further improve the no-show rate for these cases.

As for the reasons cited by INS officers in some of the denials, we will further articulate our concerns with INS about the general

remark that the applicants "failed to establish their single status at the time of their father's interview." We have also seen cases where ODP cited seemingly minor discrepancies in the birth certificates, such as the occupation of the father at the time of the birth of the adult children applicants.

After receiving your letter of July 7th, our Association contacted all the of the cases discussed in your letter. Most of the applicants say that they do not have any further documentation to submit and they ask how they can take a DNA test to establish their relationship. Our Association is under the impression that the US government pays for such testing in refugee cases and that the applicants pay if they are immigrants. The same situation applies to those cases in which ODP has found the "presentation of fraudulent documents. These applicants also ask about DNA testing.

We would ask your assistance in understanding the policy regarding the availability, applicability, and expense regarding the use of DNA testing to establish the relationship between the former political prisoner and their over-21 children. Your letter of July 29th mentions the case of Luu Quang Nghia (H-31-926, IV#380700) and states that the case will be presented to INS when the results of the testing is submitted. With DNA testing now so conclusive, why cannot this procedure be more widely used in cases where INS doubts the paternity of the over-21 children of the former political prisoners? How can we make this conclusive test readily available and affordable in those cases where INS will not accept other documentation and evidence.

Again, I thank you for your detailed information on the cases our association asked you to look into and we will continue to welcome your assistance with other cases that come to our attention. We have enclosed a second list of denied cases for your suggestions.

You can rest assured our Association is committed to working with you and ODP to realize the fair, consistent, reasonable and humane implementation of the McCain amendment consistent with law, federal regulations and the intent of Congress.
