Tears rolled down my cheeks as I walked away, tears of happiness that I'll feel for a very long time, if other vets could experience the happiness I felt, then life wouldn't be such a long hard grind.

Not once did we run out of things to say, we talked about all the good times that we had, and it only hit me on the way to the car, of the things we talked about none of it was bad.

I think it was the first time since I returned home, that I didn't think of the bad and remembered the good, I'm really looking forward to getting together again, so we can remember Vietnam the way that we should.

Now we're going to try to find the others, we'll keep looking and finding more and more, maybe by chance if we can find the rest, then we can all come home from that crazy old war.....

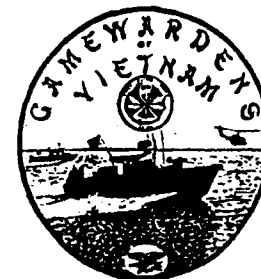
REMARKS BY MEMBERSHIP:
