Re: HAL-3 "Seawolves" reunion


Dear Mr. Thompson:

As the former NILO, CHAU DOC and NILO, TAN CHAU, RVN, I had the privilege to fly "backseat" with HAL-3 DET 5 from Navy Ops Base Chau Doc, OCT 71-MAR 72. Even this young blackshoe LT knew that he was flying with the best, and would always be making a round trip. LCDR Kim HULL, LT Mike STASICA, LT MULLEN, LTJG Jerry CAMPBELL and LTJG Phil JAMISON are more than just names in my log book--they were real pros whom I will not forget.
