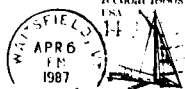

Again, many thanks for all your courtesies. Hope we see you in St. Louis in 1988. The good Lord willing and the creek doesn't rise.

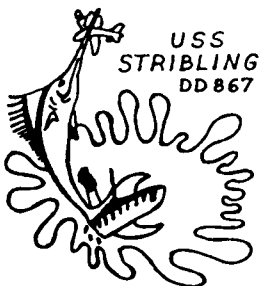

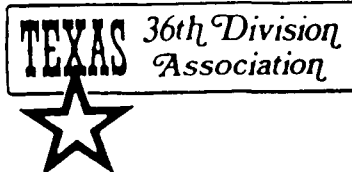
