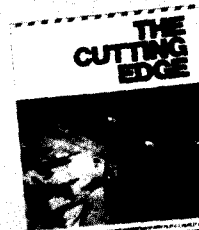
STEICHEN AT WAR: Naval Aviation in the Pacific
