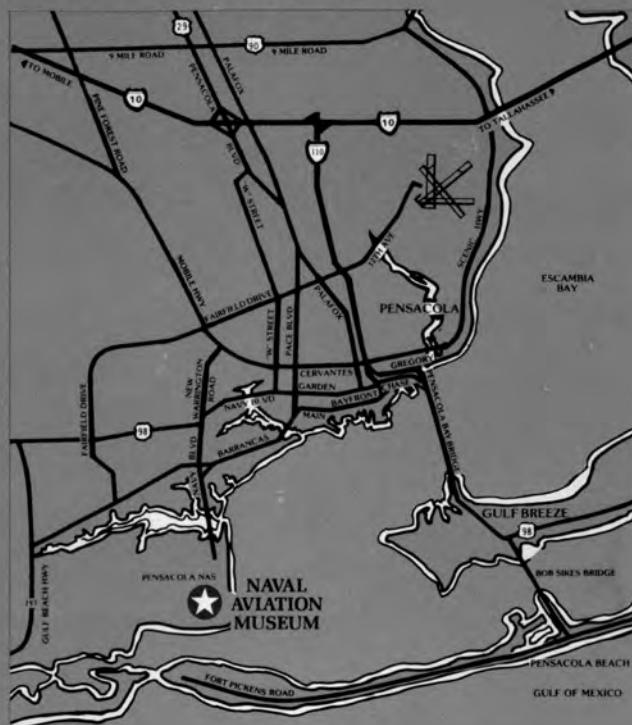

DIRECTIONS TO THE MUSEUM...

ON INTERSTATE 10:

- From Mobile, take Exit 2 (Pine Forest Road) south. Follow signs to NAS Pensacola/Museum.
- From Tallahassee, take Exit 4 (Interstate I110) south to Garden Street Exit. Go West on Garden (US 98)/Navy Blvd. Go south to NAS.
- From Ft. Walton Beach, take US 98 through Pensacola (Garden St./Navy Blvd). Go south to NAS.

FROM US 29

- Take US 29 to Garden St. Go West on Garden St./Navy Blvd. to NAS.

FROM US 90

- Take US 29 south to Garden Street. Go West on Garden St./Navy Blvd. to NAS.

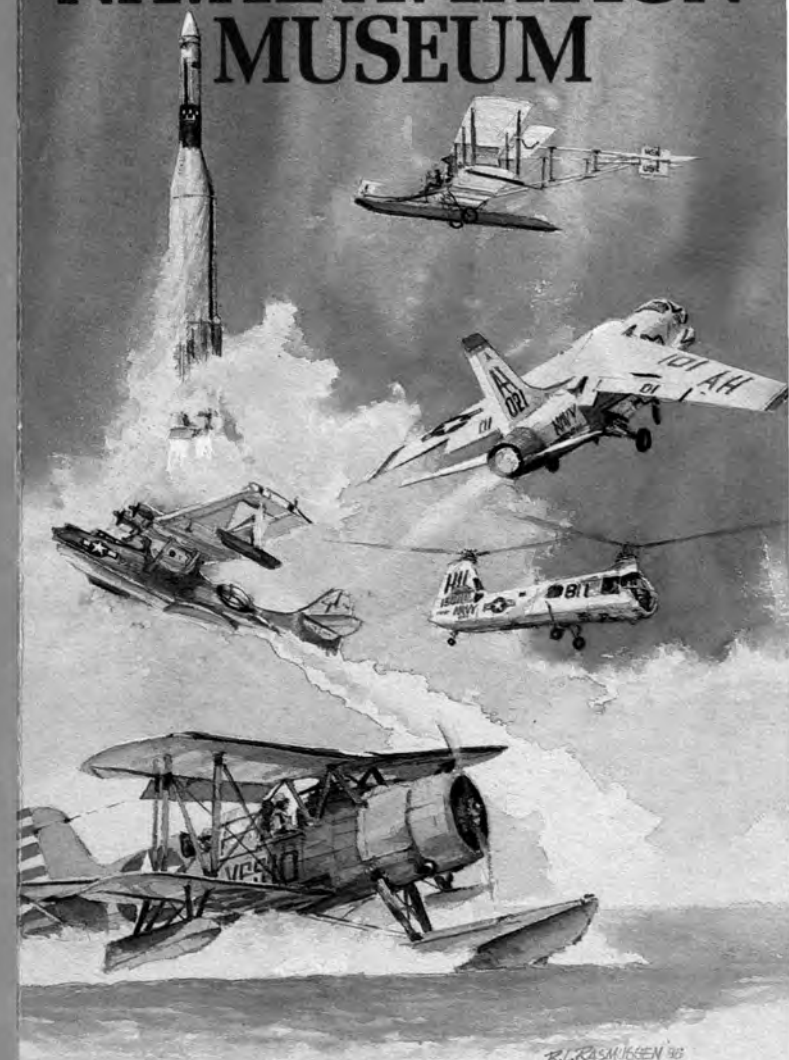

On Display at the Naval Aviation Museum

NC-4 Flying Boat—that made the first trans-Atlantic air crossing.

Skylab Command Module—in which a Navy crew circled Earth for 28 days.

Authentic Replica—of the Navy's first Curtiss Biplane.

F6F Hellcat-F4U Corsair—and many other historically significant combat aircraft.

Original Prototype—of the Navy's newest fighter jet, the F-18.
