5. Two copies of Vietnam Magazine. Spring 1990 (Vol.2, No.1) Article "Seawolves Of The Mekong Delta" by Dick Rose contains 7 pages and extensive photographs.
6. Two Copies of Vietnam Magazine. Summer 1990 (Vol.2, No.2) Article Task Force 116 by Ed Marolda, of the Naval Historical Center, contains 8 pages and photographs of Seawolf helicopters.

26. Various editions of Pacific Stars and Stripes that contain no Seawolf or Navy articles.
27. One 4 page article on the history of HA(L)-3. Source and publication unknown.
28. Video tape entitled "River Rats". 26 minutes long by Military Films, Inc. Produced by Joseph Dickstein, Written & Directed by Robert E. Ball, Jr. This film has excellent Seawolf footage. It is essentially a new soundtrack and some reediting of an official Navy film of which the HA(L)-3 Historian has a copy (Contained on the Michael Madrid video).

10. Roster of all Squadron Officers aboard from April 1969 to April 1970.
11. Packet from Capt. Charlie Borgstrom containing the Squadron Command Presentation "HA(L)-3 Past, Present and Future, Dec. 1, 1971" Contains copies of photos of all Detachment locations.
