Was killed in July 1986 in a hit and run incident while jogging on a Sunday morning near N.A.S. North Island. I tried to find a phone number but now was listed so apparently Pat has since moved elsewhere. All the Wolves I've talked to have agreed that this man was someone special. Sorry that we didn't get to meet him.

All the six individuals listed above were at Dong Tam when that huge ammo dump took a direct hit with a mortar round and "blew all of us on our ass even in the bunker". It also blew over both of the helos that were trying to get launched during the mortar attack. Alfred H. Suhr was killed and "Heater" was pinned under one of the helo's skids with the engine still running and fuel pouring all over everywhere. He had his 45 cal. out, presumably to shoot his leg off or shoot the skid away. Romanelli was "running around with an axe threatening to solve the problem". Finally a door gunner had the presence to go back and lean on the tail stinger. Even with the helo on it's side the skid came right up and heater scrambled to safety. Both Det's 4 and 6 were located at Dong Tam at the time.

I could sure use a current roster (muster). The latest one I have is missing one page and has dozens of Wolves that were left out. If you get a chance I'd appreciate you running me another. It helps me a lot in tracking down lost Wolves and re-finds.

Hope that all is well in California. I'm hoping to get off of my annual training with the Guard in time to fly right out to the reunion but it looks a little doubtful at the moment. Hopefully I'll see you there.

I believe that all six of the individuals listed above, and my Kansas City Seawolf buddy, Al Ross, were all at Dong Tam when the massive ammo dump took a direct mortar hit and blew up "blowing us all on our ass even in the bunker" and killing Alfred H. Suhr. "Heater" was pinned under the skid with the engine still running and fuel pouring out everywhere. He had his 45 out, presumably to shoot his leg off or shoot the skid away. Romanelli was "running around with an axe threatening to solve the problem. Finally a door gunner had the presence to go back and lean on the tail stinger. Even with the help on it's side, the skid came right up and Heater scrambled to safety! The time frame for all six of these individuals was 1968-1969. Both Dets 4 and 6 were at Dong Tam at that time.
