13,761,000 .762 rounds fired
155,000 2.75 inch rockets fired
800,000 rounds of fifty and thirty cal rounds fired

During TET of 68 275 M60 barrels burned out. Squadron had to borrow barrels from a Marine unit in Danang, HMN 165 flew the emergency barrels to HAL-3 in a H46.

Hal-3 was decommissioned in March 1972. Approximately 3,000 men were rotated through the squadron. We have found, to date, 501 Wolves.
