IMPORTANT TRAVEL INFORMATION

Northwest Airlines will grant us a group travel discount from June 7th through June 21th. The special Seawolf Northwest Code number is 15199. The discount rate (for U.S. Attendees) is 40% from regular coach fare or 5% savings from lowest applicable round trip fare. Northwest will provide Seawolf Association a free ticket for each forty flights booked to the reunion. I will raffle the bonus tickets during the banquet.

Additionally, one of our members, Jim Petrovich, wife owns a travel agency. Jim's wife Sharon has made us this offer. Adventure Worlds Travel of Pensacola will be pleased to handle everything including rental cars, hotels, and airline reservations. She will set up a file to keep track of frequent flyer points and ensure that Northwest gets all the info they need to get the free ticket for each forty reservations. Sharons number is 1-800-253-5053. she will make all arrangements and mail the tickets at the same price as you could get by working directly with the airlines. In addition, Sharon has agreed to rebate to the Seawolf Association 1.5% (one and a half percent) of the cost of each ticket run through her office by any Seawolf for the reunion. Just identify yourself as a Seawolf. If the area you live in is not serviced by Northwest, Sharon may be able to group enough people together to arrange a discount at another airline without jeopardize arrangements with Northwest.

The reunion guest speaker will be RADM Arthur W. Price

In November 1939, RADM Price enlisted in the Navy. Upon completion of recruit training, he attended Aviation Metalsmith School in Pensacola, Florida. His first duty station was board the USS WRIGHT (AV-1) homeported in Pearl Harbor. In September 1941 he was transferred to Patrol Squadron FOURTEEN at NAS Kaneohe Bay where he was present during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. In 1943, he returned to the continental United States to commence an 18-month course in the aviation flight program which culminated in his designation as Naval Aviator in November 1944.

Assignments as an aviator included those of engineering test pilot, duty with fighter Bomber Squadron SEVENTY-FIVE, COMNAVAIRPAC, USS FLOYDS BAY (AVP-40) and NAS Pt. Mugu.

In 1956, RADM PRICE changed his designator to Surface Line. Following a tour of duty with DESRON THIRTY-SIX, RADM PRICE was Executive Officer of USS STRIBLING (DD-867). On February, 14 1958, RADM PRICE assumed command of USS LIDDLE (APD-60). He later attended the University of Maryland earning this B.S. in Military Science in June 1961. From 1961 to June 1963 RADM PRICE served as Commanding Officer USS ASHLAND (LSD-1). He attended the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California, receiving a degree in Naval Management in June 1964. He was then assigned to the Staff of commander Amphibious Forces. U. S. Pacific Fleet, as Force Operations Officer.

August 1966 saw RADM PRICE take command of the new amphibious ship USS DULUTH (LPD-6). RADM PRICE than spent fifteen months as Commander River Patrol Force (CTF-116) in the Mekong Delta. In July of 1970, RADM PRICE assumed command of amphibious Squadron ELEVEN and while deployed to WestPac, RADM PRICE was selected for Rear Admiral, and in May of that year, he assumed his first flag billet, that of Deputy Commander of the Naval Forces Vietnam, ultimately relieving as Commander of U.S. Naval Forces Vietnam.

In March 1975, with the disestablishment of the Amphibious Forces, he became the Inspector General of the new Surface Force, Pacific Fleet. In July 1975, RADM PRICE was placed on the temporary disability retired list. On 1 July 1980, he was transferred from the temporary list to full retirement, having served a total of forty years and eight months, a career covering six decades, from the 30's to the 80's, and progressing thru the pay grades of Apprentice Seaman to Rear Admiral.


