"GAMEWARDENS of VIETNAM ASSOCIATION, INC." started in 1968 and consists of U.S. Navy Veterans, mainly of the River Patrol Force -TF 116- (Operation Gamewarden), TF-115, TF-117 and all other related combat and support units with service in Vietnam.

The River Patrol Force operated in the Mekong Delta Region of the Republic of South Vietnam from 1966 until 1971. Task Force 116 included River Patrol Boats (PBR's), NAVY SEALS and Seawolf Helicopter Gunships. TF 115 and TF 117 included: Minecraft, LST's, Swift Boats, Riverine Forces and other Inshore combat units. ALL are members of the Association. Gamewardens have many members world-wide and know there are other veterans out there who don't know of this organization. Many people join to locate buddies, find answers about what happened to their outfits

after they left and to talk things out. It's great to be able to talk to someone who was there, in combat, and probably in the same unit!

GAMEWARDENS is incorporated in the Commonwealth of Virginia and is "Tax Exempt" by the IRS. Their purpose is to "Revere the memory of those men who lost their lives in the service of their country." They have monthly board meetings in Norfolk, occasional LOCAL chapter meetings and an annual NATIONAL Reunion held around the country. There are 7 active, regional chapters: Norfolk, VA.-Headquarters; San Diego, CA.-WEST COAST chapter; Albany, Oregon-NORTHWEST chapter; Stonington, CONN.-NORTHEAST chapter; Charleston, SC/Atlanta, GA.-SOUTHEAST REGION chapter; San Antonio, TX-TEXAS chapter; and Cincinnati, Ohio-OHIO, KENTUCKY, INDIANA chapter. (To contact one near you, write to the address above.)

Other functions of the association: Student Scholarship grants are awarded each Spring. Two Memorial Monuments (one on the East coast and one on the West coast) are dedicated to the Navy men killed in Vietnam. A service to the men listed on the monuments is held every year. They support the community by annual "Civic Action" donations to and for veteran projects; help support each other to "fill in some blanks" about other people -where they are, if they made it back and sometimes just to lend an ear and listen. They all share information about: problems, concerns and the latest health-care programs available through the VA and other resources... (A topic we ALL are watching carefully). Provide a communication network consisting of others "who were there." They are also a source of substantiating claims by possibly locating a buddy and sharing common interests.

Reunions allow a time for fun and camaraderie. To share photos and stories and to remember the men and service to Vietnam. Please join us! There are: Life, Annual, Memorial and Associate memberships available.

Dear C.J.


